

State Supreme Court Hears Anti-Picketing Arguments

SALEM — The Oregon Supreme Court heard arguments Wednesday in a suit to determine whether the 1953 Legislature's anti-picketing law is constitutional.

Attorneys for employers and labor organizations tangled over the main point: Whether the law denies free speech as guaranteed in the federal and state constitutions.

The case is on appeal from a decision by Circuit Judge William G. East, Eugene, who held the heart of the law to be unconstitutional. Two other circuit courts also have ruled the same way. The dispute is over this section of the law:

"It shall be unlawful for any person to picket any employer or employee unless such person has been certified or is recognized as the bargaining representative of such employer" under federal or state law.

Attorneys for the State Federation of Labor and State Industrial Union Council argued that section restricts peaceful picketing, and that it therefore denies free speech.

Lawyers for the employers contended that the right of free speech is not involved. They said "picketing may be limited by a state in exercise of its police power. Its reasonableness determines if a law is constitutional."

Members of the Senate Labor and Industries Committee attended the hearing. This committee already is considering a bill to repeal the law.

The law sets up machinery for employees to choose their bargaining agents. The state labor examiner, Fred G. Scherer, administers it.

The anti-picketing section, however, is the only part at issue. The suit was brought by Julius and Carmen A. Gilbertson, owners of Paul Bunyan Burgers, a drive-in at Eugene. Scherer joined them in the suit.

The suit followed an order by Scherer telling Culinary Alliance

and Bartenders Union, Local 643, AFL, to stop picketing the drive-in. He ruled that the union was picketing for the purpose of influencing the Gilbertsons to sign a contract with the union.

Both sides cited numerous court decisions to uphold their positions. The attorneys for the Gilbertsons also said that the anti-picketing section protects the right of employees to stay out of a union.

The attorneys for the labor unions answered:

"Broad sweeping prohibitions against peaceful picketing cannot be sustained. Prohibitions against peaceful picketing violate constitutional rights."

Panama Extends Martial Law For 10 More Days

PANAMA — The National Assembly has extended for 10 more days the state of siege declared following the assassination Jan. 3 of President Jose Antonio Remon.

As it had in originally voting the modified form of martial law, the Assembly said its purpose was to facilitate the so far fruitless investigation into the machine-gunning of Remon. The original decree would have expired Thursday.

The state of siege, under which most constitutional guarantees are suspended, has had little effect on everyday life in the capital. Mainly it has enabled investigators to arrest persons for questioning without warrants, and those arrested are unable to obtain freedom by habeas corpus proceedings.
