

President Favors Legislation For GI Education

WASHINGTON (AP) — The White House said Thursday that President Eisenhower is "very much in favor" of pending legislation to let servicemen continue to build up GI education rights if they are in service by the end of this month.



On Jan. 1 the President signed an executive order which terminated all such rights as of the end of this month. Under that order, men already in the service by that date are entitled to schooling rights accrued before that time, but are not permitted to build up additional rights.

James C. Hagerty, White House press secretary, was asked whether the President would support bills already introduced in Congress to permit servicemen to continue to build up school rights if they are in service before Feb. 1.

"We would be very much in favor of it," Hagerty said. "The President believes it would be unfair to take that (schooling accrual rights) away from men already in service."

Hagerty added that the President had no alternative but to terminate such accrual rights in his executive order. He said continuation of the rights would require legislation.

Intestinal Ailment Plaguing Portlanders

PORTLAND (AP) — An intestinal ailment is plaguing large numbers of Portlanders and its cause is a puzzle.

It holds on longer than most illnesses of that sort and it often recurs after the patient has seemed to have recovered.

It is disabling but it is not serious although many patients have been hospitalized with it. Those are some of the observations made Wednesday by Dr. Russell L. Baker, Portland internist, commenting for the Multnomah County Medical Society.

Dr. Samuel B. Osgood, epidemiologist of the State Board of Health, agreed that the ailment is mostly in Portland with "relatively little indication" of it elsewhere in the state.

5th Amendment Doctor Promoted, Then Demoted

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.) said Thursday night the Army had promoted to corporal a doctor who had invoked the Fifth Amendment on questions about Communism. A few hours later, the Army reported Pfc. Marvin S. Belsky's promotion had been cancelled and his commander reprimanded.

McCarthy, who likened the Belsky case to that of the former Army dentist, Maj. Irving Peress, said he had learned the promotion was made "within the last six weeks." He said he had asked for a report from the Army.

Later, the Army issued an announcement saying Belsky's promotion had been revoked because it violated regulations. The Army also said Col. Arthur J. Redland, Belsky's commanding officer at Murphy General Hospital, Waltham, Mass., had been given a formal reprimand.

At Waltham, Col. Redland declined comment and a hospital spokesman said Belsky was on leave until Jan. 19. He could not be located for possible comment.

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
