SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Five little war orphans—children of American fathers and Japanese mothers—arrived Sunday on their way to foster homes. Three boys and two girls, 6 to 8, were greeted by new families and friends—and newsreel, television and newspaper cameramen. They were the first to arrive from Japan under the Refugee Act of 1953.

Judge Says 'Not Guilty' In Beer Possession Case

A 20-year-old Sutherlin youth, Gerald John Hall, was freed of a charge of illegally possessing liquor when District Judge Warren A. Woodruff handed down a "not guilty" verdict Friday.

Hall pleaded innocent before going on trial Tuesday. The judge gave his verdict after pointing out there was a lack of evidence to show the young man had actual physical possession of a bottle of beer found in his car.

The beer was found by a special deputy sheriff at Lindy's Sportsmen's Center Saturday night. Arrested at the same time were 15 and 16-year-old Roseburg girls and a 16-year-old Sutherlin boy.

Juvenile Court Judge Carl C. Hill said the two girls and the boy have been placed on probation. One had been in juvenile court before, but the others had not. The boy was charged with being drunk in a public place. One of the girls was cited for curfew violation, the other for vagrancy.
