Permanent Certificates Asked For Feeder Lines

WASHINGTON (AP) — Local service airlines—known as feeder lines—should be given permanent rather than temporary operating certificates, Rep. Williams (D-Miss) reports.

He said he would introduce a bill to require the Civil Aeronautics Board to issue permanent certificates to the 14 local service airlines now operating.

Williams said trunk lines have permanent certificates and that the local carriers should have the same type of authorization. Local lines now get certificates good for from three to seven years which must be renewed from time to time.

Local service lines include Pioneer, Southwest, and West Coast.

Canadian Gas Reserves Said To Be Tremendous

WASHINGTON (AP) — A geologist has estimated that natural gas reserves in the Canadian province of Alberta available to Trans-Canada Pipe Line Ltd. total more than four trillion cubic feet.

Everett Trostel, representing a Dallas firm of geologists, testified at a Power Commission hearing. He said the requirements of Trans-Canada can be met through its gas fields for 19 years on a basis of proved reserves and for 25 years on proved and probable reserves.

He also testified an additional one trillion cubic feet of gas probably will be located yearly in Alberta for the next several years.

Trostel testified in support of an application by Northern Natural Gas Co. of Omaha for federal authority to buy and import 100 million cubic feet of gas daily from Trans-Canada.

With this additional Canadian gas, Northern proposes to serve 66 more towns in North Dakota, Minnesota, South Dakota and Iowa.

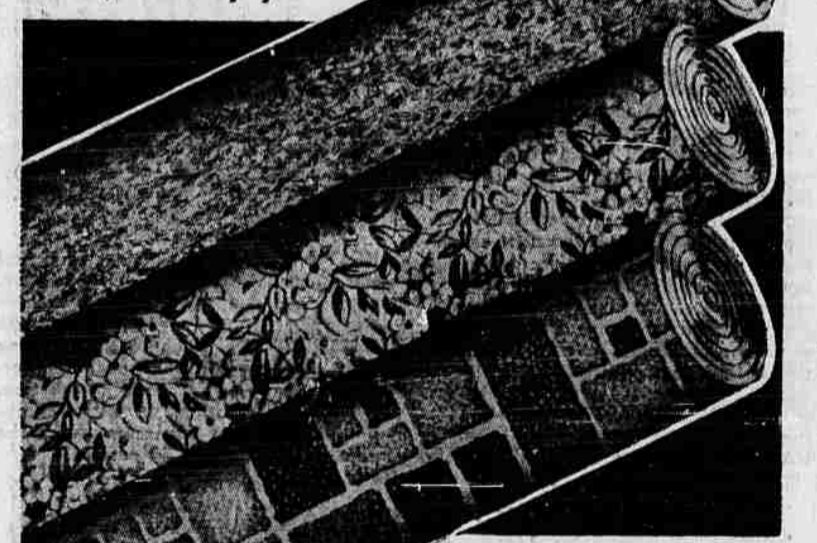
