

In The Spring A Woman's Fancy Turns To Fashions

Let one ray of sunshine break through the winter clouds and a young woman's thoughts turn to spring fashions. This is the season for young colors to come to the fore and fashion designers are going all-out this year, featuring such eye-catching colors as hot pink, lime and violet in play clothes. Navy is still a top color in dressy fashions, with designers emphasizing lines—trim and slim this year.

Resort and spring fashion collections emphasize the long torso line, the higher neckline and the easy look. Shown in all types of clothes, including active sports, as well as formal date attire, the longer waisted look is expertly interpreted in new cotton.

The easy look is noted in over-bustle two-pieces, middie tops and in boxy jacketed suits. Striped and plain colored cotton tweed is featured in a long torso blouse worn with a slim skirt. One designer favors a middie silhouette which she elasticizes in back to give full back

interest. Made in vivid turquoise no-iron cotton, this costume shows today's great interest in the look of the 20's.

Designers have their own particular ways of emphasizing the long torso look. One features a line that dips at either side at the hip-line and flares the skirt out in a big way. A date frock styled to these lines is made in white embroidered cotton faille.

Contrasting bands at the hipline, drapings, contrasting bindings, bows and emphasis on pleated or gathered skirts at this long line are favored ways to show the long torso. Spaced pleats and side fullness also emphasize a longer line. Printed cottons in all the colors of the rainbow as well as in dramatic black and white are used for daytime cottons styled on these lines.

Swim Cottons
Bathing suits reflect the new silhouette. Gentle curves are the order of the day in bodices, long moulded torso, corselet draped hiplines. For these suits, printed cottons are featured in a glorious array of modern abstract prints as well as in plain colors. Designers like the influence of Japanese art in printed cottons, as well as the colorful art of Egypt and the Far East.

This is the year for lots of color in sporting life cottons. Separate jackets, skirts, shorts, pants, camisoles and blouses favor brilliant hues in poplins, no-iron cottons, sailcloth and cotton sharkskin.

Hot pink, lime, violet and orange are featured in poplin play separates trimmed in black or white ribbon looping. For greater opulence and more color, one designer uses gold embroidery on bright plaid denim. A straight beach jacket and one-piece boy-shorts bathing suit, as well as separate shorts, skirts and sundresses feature this new "designing" touch on a classic cotton.

Printed cottons that look as if they had stepped out of the world of the painter into the world of fashion are shown in water-color effects—dazzling blues and greens used together, or oranges, reds and yellows fused to look like a painting. Prints of this kind are used by sportswear designers for jackets, bathing suits, pants, blouses and skirts. Combined with a rough textured, plain colored cotton in bold colors, these cotton separates are outstanding.

Cotton sharkskin in turquoise is used for a short skirt and worn over a striped cotton knit shirt and shorts for bright color emphasis. White middies are combined with bright colored pants—an orange overalls in middie silhouette features rows of multi-colored stitching.

McKay Selects Board To Help Klamath Indians

SALEM (AP) — Interior Sec. McKay has chosen a board of three men to help the Klamath Indians settle problems in connection with winning their freedom, a conference of federal and state officials was told here Tuesday.

Members of this board, which will appraise the big timber holdings on the reservation, are Tom Watters, former mayor of Klamath Falls; William Phillips, Salem businessman; and Eugene Favell, Lakeview lawyer.

Attending the meeting were representatives of several Indian tribes, the U. S. Indian Service, and the State Department of Education.

After the appraisal of the timber is finished, the Indians will be able to sell their lands. They either could divide the money, or set up a corporation to operate the reservation.

McKay was given authority by Congress to name the board.

Rex Lee, associate U. S. Indian commissioner, said there will be many more meetings between the officials and the Indians.

He said taxation is a big problem in connection with the freeing of the Indians. They now pay income taxes, but no property taxes.

SOMETHING NEW in sports togs. Her gay two-piece in plaid cotton is assured of eye and silhouette appeal through a bold outline use of the plaid.



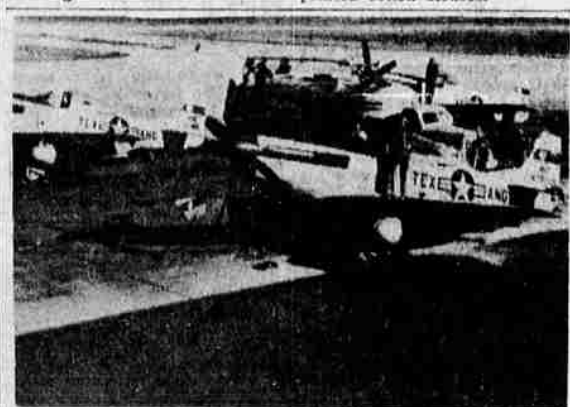

Dulles Will Get Full Dope From Hammarskjold

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of State Dulles announced Tuesday he will get first-hand information here Wednesday from Dag Hammarskjold on the United Nations secretary general's mission to Red China seeking release of American airmen imprisoned as spies.

He rejected the contention of Sen. Knowland (R-Calif.) that the mission had been a failure.

Residents To Vote On Whether Pets Should Run Free

SPOKANE (AP) — The city's dogs, with their freedom at stake, will be on the Spokane general election ballot on March 8.

The City Council, hounded in the past by residents who claim foot-loose canines are a pest and destroy property, decided Monday to let the voters say whether dogs should be penned or leashed or allowed to run free.

It's an advisory proposition and, if put into law, would provide city ordinance making it a misdemeanor for owners who allow their dogs to run around. Spokane has 14,345 licensed dogs.

Another proposition on the ballot would raise the salary of city commissioners from the current \$5,000 a year to \$7,200.

Air Force Rushes Aid To Crashed Airplane

MEDELLIN, Colombia (AP) — The U. S. Air Force rushed aid Wednesday to the crew of one of its rescue amphibians which crashed in the Andes 50 miles southwest of here. First reports from the site said two airmen were killed and four were injured.

The plane was one of two from Albrook Air Force Base in Panama which had been searching for G. O. Rockwell, Houston, Tex., oil man, and his wife, missing since Dec. 16 on a flight over Colombia.
