'Mae West' Life Belt

Betrays Opium Peddler

SEATTLE (AP) — Twenty pounds of smoking opium estimated to be worth \$8,000 wholesale were seized by customs inspectors at the Seattle-Tacoma International airport Monday.

Frank W. Hull, collector of customs, said an American citizen of Chinese descent attempted to conceal the opium, in declared jewelry and Chinese herbs in a "Mae West" life belt beneath his clothing.

Because the passenger "looked a little heavy around the waist," he was searched by M. W. Ponak, supervisory customs inspector.

The passenger, who had boarded the plane in Hong Kong en route to New York, was to be charged with smuggling, Hull said.
