

CHARLESTON, S. C. — Adm. Robert B. Carney, Chief of Naval Operations, said this week the Soviets "are developing new weapons and new uses of weapons" and are "constantly strengthening their armed forces."

The threat from international Communism, he added, "is just as great today as it ever was" and the only cause for optimism "is the apparent improvement in our own situation."

In an address prepared for delivery at The Citadel, a military school here, Carney said: "The Communists are covertly attacking our liberties every hour of the day, every day of the year, and have been since the end of World War II; they are continuously on the offensive, if not on the battlefield, then in the free speech and free economy to serve their own black and loathsome purposes."

"If we are to copy with today's perpetrators of falsehood and deception," Carney added, "our most important long-range objective must be the achievement of an alliance possessing a more solid base in free nations, in armed might, in raw materials, in industry and educational product-

ivity than the Communists are able to command."

"The situation calls for a national and international educational effort to the end that we all have leaders who can keep pace with an environment that is constantly changing."

FBI Grabs Another Of Ten 'Most Wanted'

SPRINGFIELD, Ill. — George Lester Belew, 41, one of the Federal Bureau of Investigation's "10 most wanted" men, was seized this week at a motel near Champaign, Ill., the FBI office in Springfield announced Tuesday.

Percy Wyly II, agent in charge of the Springfield FBI office, said Belew was wanted in Kansas. He said he had been arrested in Hays, Kan., July 30, 1954 on a fraudulent check charge but escaped from the Hays jail four days later after assaulting a jailer. A federal warrant for unlawful flight from Kansas to escape prosecution was issued in Salina, Kan., on Aug. 7, 1954, Wyly said.

The FBI agent said Belew also had been arrested in Fargo, N. D., May 6, 1953, for passing fraudulent checks in Lemmon, S. D.

U.S. Millions Due For Economic Aid To Far East

WASHINGTON — The administration plans to provide between 500 and 600 million dollars for economic aid in the Far East in the year starting July 1.

Treasury Secretary Humphrey, disclosing the size of the program for the first time this week in an NBC television interview, did not say how much of it would be loans and how much grants. Details, including the amount for each country, are still being worked out, he said.

An aide said the Asian share will be about 50 million dollars more than last year, and Humphrey said "I think we have provided all the money we can spend wisely and effectively" in that area.

President Eisenhower, in his budget message a week ago called for \$3,675,000,000 for military aid and \$1,025,000,000 for economic aid throughout the world. Humphrey gave no breakdown for the military aid program.

The treasury secretary told a questioner he thought the 34 billions provided for the United States military program included enough to take care of "a small hot war" if this country should get involved.

Life Rap Handed Two Teen-Age Thrill Slayers

NEW YORK — Brooklyn's two teen-age thrill killers were sentenced to life imprisonment this week for the slaying of Willard Menter, 34, who was tortured, beaten and thrown into the East River.

Judge Hyman Barshay in passing sentence said the youths never would be eligible for parole. The jury recommended mercy when it convicted Jack Koslow, 18, and Melvin Mittman, 17, of first degree murder in the drowning of Menter Aug. 18. The youths heard the sentences calmly, but the parents of each burst into tears.

The youngest of the original gang of four, Robert Trachtenberg, 15, was previously adjudged a juvenile delinquent and committed to a youth home for an indefinite period.

The case against the fourth, Jerome Leiberman, 17, was dismissed, but he still faces a manslaughter charge in another killing attributed to the gang.
