

Lookingglass School Has Come A Long Way Since Early Times

It's a far cry from the one-room building of 1866 in which the Rev. A. L. Todd opened the first school in Lookingglass with some 60 pupils in all grades, to the fully standardized, modern school of Lookingglass today.

The original building stood near the present home of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Schulze on the south side of the Valley and was on the donation land claim taken up by the Rev. Mr. Todd. The land was later acquired by Elijah Ollivant, grandfather of Mrs. Schulze.

In about 1884 the school was opened in a 30 x 80 foot two-story frame building on the present site. The lower floor was divided into two rooms which were occupied by the school. The upper floor was one large room used for a dance hall and other community gatherings.

County Judge Carl Hill is remembered by the old timers as a teacher, around the turn of the century in the old building. In the summer of 1908 the old building was torn down and the lumber utilized to construct a one-story two-room building which forms the nucleus for the present structure. The large trees surrounding the present building were planted there by patrons of the first school.

Tax Bills On Patterson Plan Offered In Senate

SALEM, Jan. 27.—Sen. J. P. Housell, Hood River, became the first Republican to openly support Patterson's plan to levy a state property tax and to remove the federal income tax deduction in figuring state income taxes.

Housell said he is going to try to persuade some House Republicans to introduce bills to carry out these ideas. All tax bills must originate in the House.

Bronze Star For Bravery Presented Frank Noel

WASHINGTON, Jan. 27.—Associated Press photographer Frank Noel received the Bronze Star Wednesday for bravery under fire and for standing up to the Communists during more than 32 months as a war prisoner in Korea.

Secretary of the Navy Charles S. Thomas presented the award in a Pentagon ceremony.

Noel was cited for bravery on the night of Nov. 29-30, 1950, when the Marine Corps convoy in which he was riding during the fighting withdrawal from the Chosin Reservoir was attacked by the enemy.

The Navy citation said Noel "fearlessly exposed himself to intense enemy fire to remove wounded Marines to safe positions and to procure urgently needed ammunition."

Gov. Patterson To Attend Session In Washington

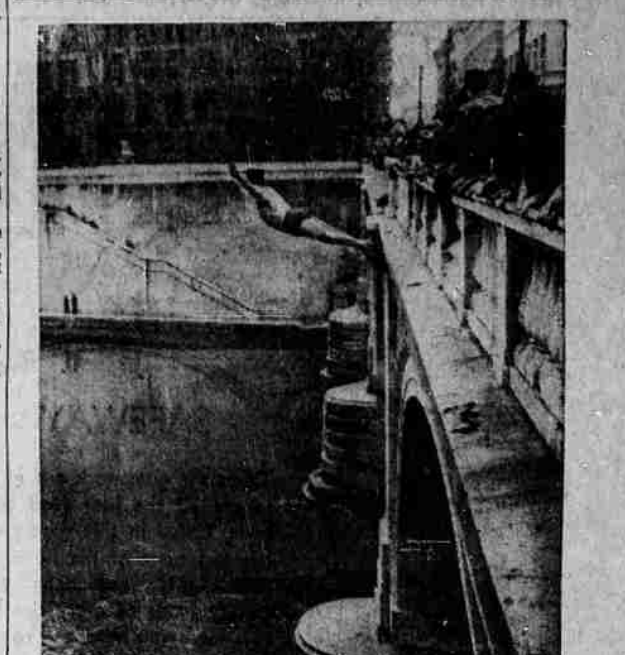
