Minority Report Against Dam Memorial Is Rejected By Vote In Oregon House

SALEM, Jan. 28.—The Oregon House of Representatives voted 34 to 25 Thursday against a minority report that would have defeated a memorial asking the federal government to build John Day Dam on the Columbia River either solely by the government, or in partnership with local agencies.

The action, in effect, adopts the majority report that the bill be passed.

The vote was almost in straight party lines, with the Democrats pleading for construction solely by the government.

The House will consider the memorial on final passage Friday.

Gov. Paul L. Patterson asked for passage of this memorial to Congress.

Rep. Maurine Neuberger, Portland Democrat and wife of Oregon's new United States senator, led the attack, asserting "there are many dangerous pitfalls" in the Eisenhower administration's partnership plan of developing the memorial. She also charged that the memorial is "wishy-washy."

Rep. Charles A. Tom, Rulis, who introduced the memorial, pleaded that the dam must be built quickly, by any means possible, in order to avert a crippling power shortage.

He also cited navigation benefits to Eastern Oregon, and expressed his doubts as to whether the federal government has the money available to build the dam by itself.

The Legislature received new bills to permit the state police to use radar to catch speeding motorists, to set up a separate state parks department, and to increase industrial accident benefits.

Radar now is used by police in several Oregon cities, but the state police don't want to use it until they are sure that its use doesn't violate the state's anti-speed trap law. The bill says the use of radar doesn't violate that law.

The independent State Parks Department would take over functions of the Parks Division of the Highway Commission. It would have \$1,000,000 a year to spend.

Two labor-sponsored measures would increase industrial accident benefits for partially disabled workers by about 10 per cent, and also broaden the coverage by eliminating the provision that these accidents must be caused by "violent and external means." Thus it would allow payments for virtually all industrial injuries.

Sen. Rudie Wilhelm Jr., Portland, introduced a bill to take away the Supreme Court's power to appoint temporary circuit judges.

Another new bill would give the Civil Service Commission power to reinstate dismissed state employees. Now it has power only to recommend reinstatement.

Other new measures would let counties spend more money to advertise their resources, permit county courts and commissions to regulate speed on county roads, and permit the Oregon Development Commission to advertise the state's resources to attract new business to the state.

The major item in Patterson's tax program, which so many Republicans dislike, finally was before the House Thursday.
