

Alaska Maneuvers To Get Underway Again Thursday

FT. RICHARDSON, Alaska (AP)—The postponed mid-winter drop of 800 Army paratroopers into an isolated Alaska wilderness area was rescheduled for the second part

of "Operation Snowbird," which got under way Thursday. Under present plans, a battalion combat team of the 503d Regiment, 11th Airborne Division, will initiate the new maneuver in the Talkeetna area, between here and Anchorage. Simulating conditions of actual warfare, they will jump into an unoccupied and undefended area, build an air strip and defend it against an "attacking" force. The

maneuver should last five to seven days. Last weekend the first part of the operation, in which a "defending" force from the 4th Infantry Division stationed at Ladd Air Base, Fairbanks, took over a Yukon River air base at Galena and the paratroopers were to be dropped to dislodge them, had to be called off.

Stormy weather over Rainy Pass prevented a 750-mile round trip formation flight of half a hundred C-119 planes from Elmendorf Air Field, Anchorage, to the Galena area for a mass paratroopers drop. Oxygen would have been needed if the planes rose to 14,000 feet to fly over the storm and a flight around the mountain range would have required refueling.

Troops which will "attack" in the Talkeetna exercise will be mostly from the 53d Infantry stationed here, and will include infantrymen and tank, reconnaissance, field artillery, heavy mortar and regimental headquarters and service companies.

The paratroopers are from among 3,000 who were airlifted north to Alaska from a southern United States base early this month.
