

DALLAS, Tex. (AP) — Bankruptcy referee D. N. Oldham Wednesday told Liberty Broadcasting System creditors to take a \$200,000 settlement of a 12 million dollar suit against 13 major league baseball teams.

He ruled the compromise offer by the baseball clubs should be accepted as a "complete settlement" of the suit filed by the broadcasting system, now defunct network, claimed Liberty Broadcasting System went bankrupt because the major league teams refused to let him broadcast their games.

Liberty was among the first to

"recreate" play-by-play action of a baseball game, dubbing in sound as it broadcast telegraphed reports of the action to simulate realism.

Out of the \$200,000 settlement, the trustee for Liberty must pay approximately \$50,000 in court costs. The rest will go toward paying off creditors.

Oldham's ruling was that each side should pay its own court costs. It becomes final in 10 days. This period will allow any creditor to protest.

McLendon had opposed acceptance of the compromise offer. The suit named as defendants all

major league baseball teams except Brooklyn and Cincinnati in the National League and Chicago in the American League. Suits against these three were dropped.

Transient Dies In Fall From Moving Automobile

EUGENE (AP) — Joseph Francis Gordon, 46, died in a hospital here Thursday after falling or jumping from a moving automobile on the Pacific Highway a mile south of Eugene.

Before he died Gordon told state police he was hitch-hiking from Seattle to Sacramento, and accidentally leaned against a door latch in a car driven by Elmer S. Harrington, Springfield.

Harrington told police Gordon deliberately jumped out shortly after he had offered Gordon a ride.

There is one known survivor, Mrs. Marie Paul, a sister, in Philadelphia.

HAMBURG, Germany (AP) — Dense fog wrapped the German North Sea coast Wednesday, bringing shipping and air traffic to a standstill.

New Bill Would Legalize Blood Test For Liquor

SALEM (AP) — A Klamath Falls physician, Dr. George Adler, has developed a plan to give blood tests to find out when drivers are drunk, and he wants it tried throughout the state.

The House Judiciary Committee introduced the two bills at the request of Speaker Ed Geary, Klamath Falls. Geary gives Dr. Adler, who is the county coroner, all the credit.

Under present law, blood tests can be given only in Multnomah County. One of Dr. Adler's bills would permit the tests in any county.

The consent of the driver to submit to the test still would have to be obtained. Blood could be with-

drawn only by a licensed physician.

Use of blood tests is permitted as court evidence only when the driver has agreed to be tested. Their use without his consent would be forcing a man to testify against himself, and that's unconstitutional.

Dr. Adler's other bill sets up a yardstick to measure when a driver is drunk.

If a driver's blood contains less than .05 per cent of alcohol, he's sober. If it's between .05 and .15

per cent, he could be considered drunk, provided other factors indicate that he is.

But if it's more than .15 per cent, there's no doubt about it. He's plastered.

TURKEY PAPERS HIT AT LEWIS

ISTANBUL, Turkey, (AP) — Two Turkish news papers snapped at American labor leader John L. Lewis Friday for proposing an American government investigate an explosion at the government-owned coal mine at Zonguldak on Turkey's Black Sea coast. More than 60 miners died in the tragedy Jan. 23. The independent newspaper Milliyet labeled Lewis "impertinent."

House Approves Measure Continuing GI Schooling

WASHINGTON (AP) — Unanimous House approval boosted Friday the chances for quick Senate passage of a bill to continue GI schooling rights for men in the armed services by Jan. 31.

The House passed the measure 386-0 Thursday and sent it to the Senate. Chairman Hill (D-Ala.) of the Senate Labor Committee said he plans hearings on the bill for next week.

The measure would assure up to 36 months of government-financed education for those in service by Jan. 31. After discharge, they will be entitled to 1 1/2 days of educational benefits for each day of service up to the maximum. It is expected to add about 350 million dollars to the cost of veterans' care.

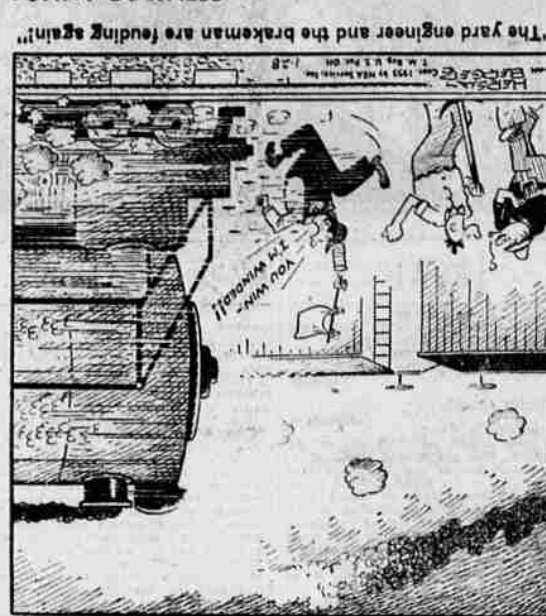
