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## Gen. MacArthur Lashes Out At Any Philosophy Which Tends To Reject Patriotism

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Gen. Douglas MacArthur, speaking on his 75th birthday at the dedication of a civic monument honoring him, hit Wednesday at "any philosophy which rejects patriotism."

Before a cheering throng estimated at 15,000 in MacArthur Park, the general of the Army urged his audience to "reject" the idea that "we have become dependent on other nations for our being and for our welfare."

Warning that "seductive mur-

murs are arising that patriotism is outmoded," MacArthur told an audience which included California Gov. Goodwin J. Knight and Los Angeles Mayor Norris J. Poulson to "repudiate that in the market place, on the platform or wherever you may meet it."

"Those who are our friends will understand," the general said. "Those who are not, we can pass by."

In acknowledging the monument, the general said: "I understand full well this monument is meant

to commemorate an epic rather than an individual, an army rather than a commander... an ideal, rather than a personality."

He paid glowing tribute to Old Testament phraseology to his comrades in arms and added: "I and this statue and this park are but the reflected monuments of their grandeur."

## Alaska Governor Seeks Harmony In Legislature

JUNEAU, Alaska (AP) — In his first message to a territorial legislature, Gov. Heintzleman Wednesday recommended an increase of 2 or 3 cents a gallon in the gasoline tax and called upon the lawmakers to guard against allowing "sectional ambitions and rivalries to divide us."

The Republican governor, in his address to the Democratic-controlled House and Senate in a joint session, covered a wide range of problems facing the territory.

He described the dwindling employment security fund as "one of the gravest problems you will face." He referred to the shaping of a budget within territorial income—in which a 12 million dollar gap is involved—as "the most important set of problems."

In discussing the general condition of the territory, the governor declared that "on the whole Alaska prospered during the past biennium," with increasing popu-

lation and industries, but the depressed condition of the fishing industry stood out with other lesser setbacks on "the dark side."

He advocated "all possible measures to see that air service is increased rather than curtailed" and for resumption of passenger ship service.

## DANA RULED OUT

PORTLAND (AP) — Marshall N. Dana cannot be a member of the Portland Dock Commission because he does not live or vote in Portland, Circuit Judge Martin W. Hawkins ruled Wednesday.

The ruling came in a court test of Portland's ordinance requiring officials to be residents of the city.

Dana, the former editor of the Oregon Journal editorial page, lives outside the city.

The general said he and his men were guided by "the most divine of human impulses"—patriotism. He said this patriotism was shown in the spirit of self sacrifice, which he described as "the noblest" development of mankind. And added:

"In this he comes closest to the image of his Creator whose son died on the cross."

The old soldier spoke with shaking head but firm voice.

Mrs. MacArthur, smiling broadly, pulled the strings which drew back the curtains revealing the 8-foot bronze statue of the general in his familiar informal battle attire, with shirt open at the neck.

In the pool in the foreground lay a reproduction of the Pacific isles from Australia to the Philippines which he and his men recaptured during World War II.

As the general strode from the park the crowd rushed in, pushing as near as restraining ropes permitted. Many reached out their hands to try and touch him.

Then they burst through the ropes and policemen had to lock arms to hold back the crush.

The general finally made his way to his scarlet automobile and departed.

The monument dedication was the first of three main events Wednesday.

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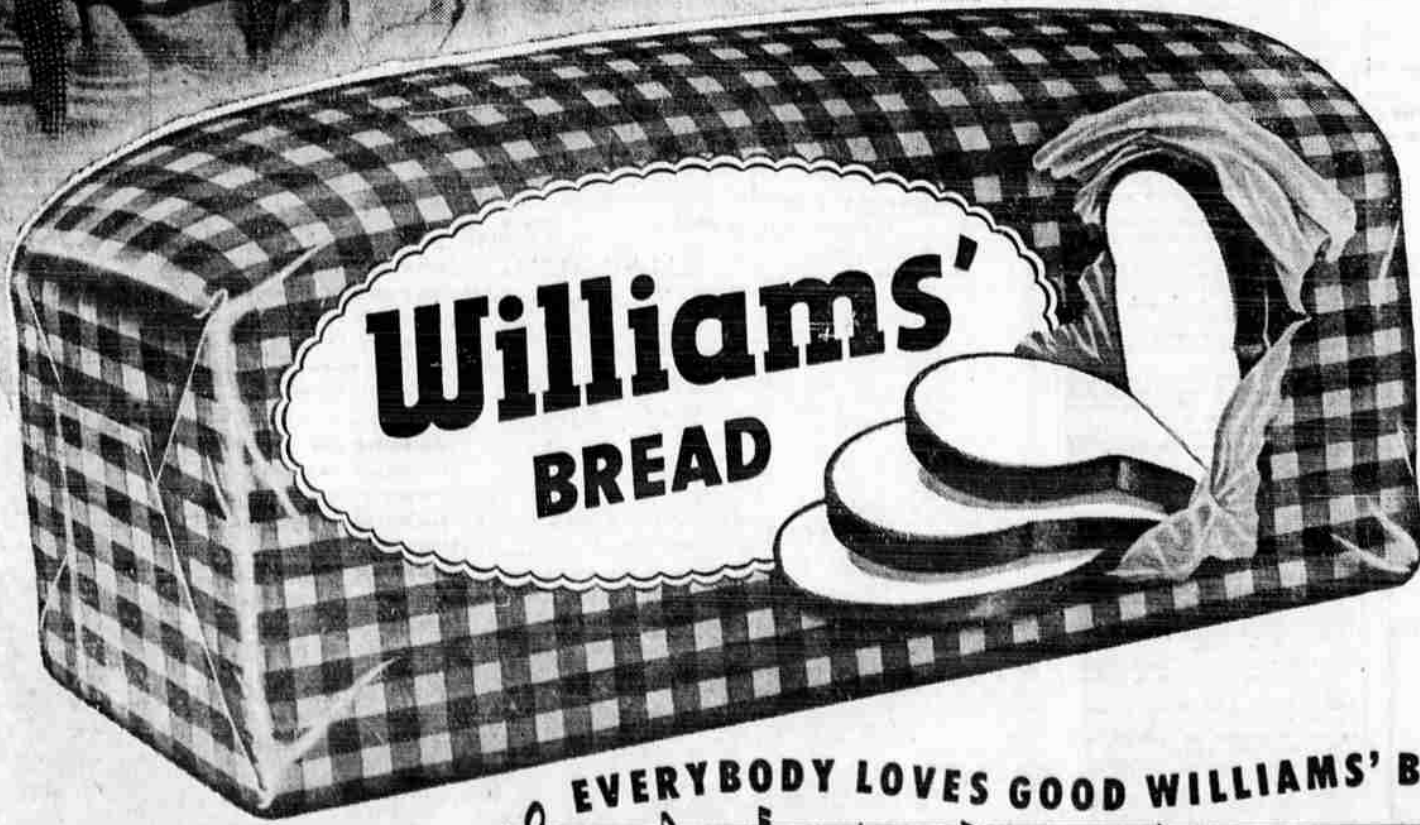
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
