There was some division of opinion today among relatives of Americans imprisoned in Red China concerning the State Department's ban on visits to the prisoners.

Secretary of State Dulles has written to relatives of the 17 Americans—15 airmen and 2 civilian employees of the Army—that the government had reached the "reluctant conclusion" to forbid travel to Communist China. In identical letters, Dulles termed the trip "imprudent for the time being" considering "the increasingly belligerent attitude" of Red China.

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## Canadians End Long Walkout

TORONTO, Ont. (AP)—CIO United Auto Workers have ended their 110-day strike against Ford of Canada.

Union and company negotiators reached agreement on a new wage contract Thursday after more than four weeks of steady bargaining sessions that followed on-and-off negotiations since the old pact expired last February.

Terms of settlement include company-paid hospital-medical insurance for employees and their families, an Ontario-wide agreement covering three Ford plants, a modified union shop, a four-cent hourly improvement factor to be effective June 15, a seventh paid holiday and inclusion of an eight-cent cost-of-living allowance in the base pay.

The contract will expire June 1, 1956. The walkout had idled more than 7,000 employees, and was the longest in Ford of Canada's history.

The program is developed by the Democrats' legislative policy committee of seven legislators and three county chairmen.

The committee said it is developing a positive approach to the tax problem that will be an alternative to a sales tax. Democrats strongly oppose a sales tax, but some Republicans want one.

Of the 90 members of the Legislature, 31 are Democrats. The Senate and House tax committees held their first joint meeting Thursday to hear the State Tax Commission explain its estimates of revenues for the next two years.

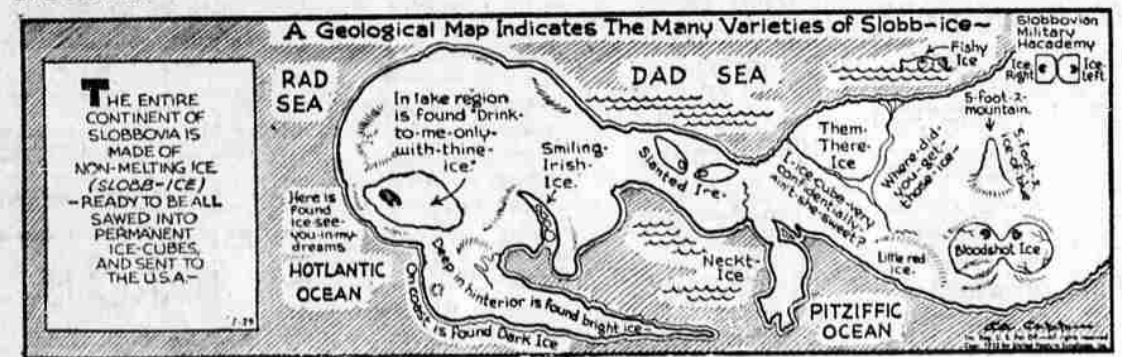
