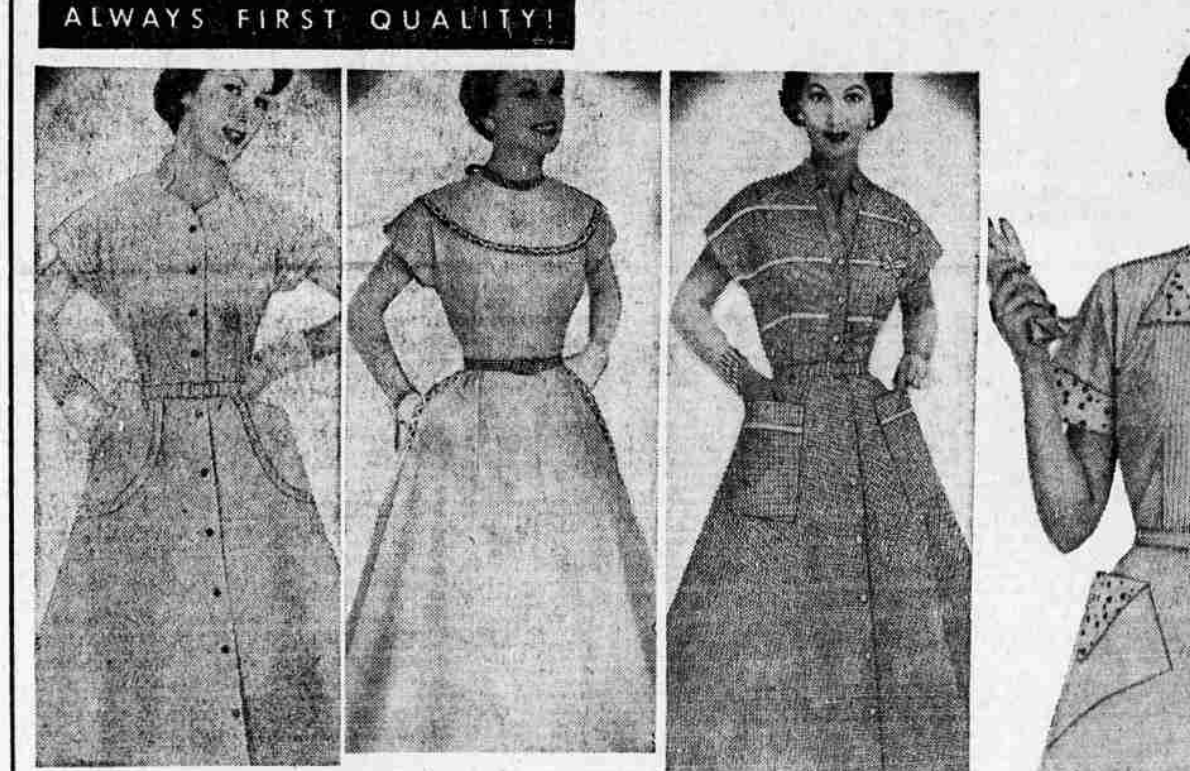
Monday is the deadline for farmers to fill out price support papers for 1954 wheat, oats or barley.
