Mr. and Mrs. Mel Huckins and three children were guests of the Sutherlin Christian Church Thursday. They are missionaries on furlough from Okinawa, and since arriving in the States last spring have spoken in many churches all over the United States.

The Huckins were guests of the noon dinner of the Christian Women's Fellowship which was attended by twenty eight adults and ten children.

In the afternoon Mrs. Huckins spoke to the group and she and two small boys, Connie and Timmy, modeled Okinawa kimonos. Contrary to the belief of most people, the kimono ensemble of a woman, is a very intricate affair, and Mrs. Huckins stated that without help, she could not put it on. The hardest part is the large sash, which employs a wide form in order that the large butterfly bow be tied properly. She stated that red was very popular for girls, but that boys never wear red and that women over thirty are classed as old and never wear red or stripes.

Mrs. Huckins stated that the word "love" is unknown to the Okinawans and until Christians went there, a love match between a young couple was unknown.

At the evening service Mr. Huckins showed many colored slides of the people, country and work of the missionaries.
