

Sen. Neuberger Disputes Claim Of Ellsworth

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WASHINGTON (AP)—Sen. Neuberger (D-Ore) disputed Wednesday what he said were implications that Rep. Ellsworth (R-Ore) that the administration has aided the Talent Reclamation Project in Southern Oregon by providing money for undertakings near that project.

He reiterated in a statement that the budget for the year beginning July 1 contains "not one single cent for construction of the Talent Irrigation Project despite lavish Republican promises in the 1954 campaign."

Ellsworth in replying to a similar statement by Neuberger recently conceded the budget had no construction funds for the Talent project, but said some had been asked previously by Secretary of the Interior McKay.

He disputed Neuberger's assertion the administration had abandoned the Talent project, however, by citing money budgeted by Eisenhower for rehabilitation of the Medford and Rogue River projects, which are separate affairs where rehabilitation had been included in the law authorizing the Talent project.

Neuberger said Wednesday: "Ellsworth is cleverly citing appropriations for other Southern Oregon items in an effort to divert attention from the abandonment of construction features by the administration."

"I regret Mr. Ellsworth calls it a 'smearlike attack' when I urge the administration to make good on its campaign promises, because I will continue to demand this administration give greater attention to the obvious needs of the Pacific Northwest."

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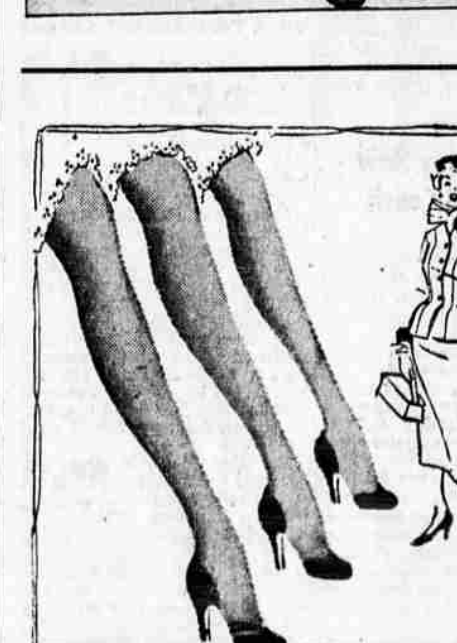
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
