Political Fur Flies In Senate Over Formosan Resolution

A little political fur flew in the Senate Thursday morning, Feb. 3, over a subject that is hardly considered controversial. The item in question was Senate Joint Resolution No. 7, which merely made a public statement of the fact that the members of the Oregon Legislature wish to be on record as backing President Eisenhower in his stand on the Formosa question.

Inasmuch as the Formosa resolutions passed the Congress with only six dissenting votes, and with five out of six of the Oregon delegation (including two Democrats) supporting him it was hardly expected that much time would be spent in argument in the state legislature.

However, wisely or unwisely, Senator Sten in a very eloquent plea for backing the bill chose to deplore the stand the Senior Senator from Oregon had taken in the national Congress. Senator Sten declared that this gentleman had gone so far as to urge people to back a "sort of Morse strategy, rather than the Eisenhower policy." No one doubted the sincerity of Senator Sten in making the remark, but he was presently accused of launching the first blow in the 1935 Senatorial campaign against Senator Morse. And then the fat was in the fire.

A good many Democrats and Republicans had to speak on the subject although the crux of the matter seemed to be that the main objection to the resolution was that it was being hurried too fast. An effort was made to have it set over until next week for consideration. But after it was pointed out that after all the Formosa subject was not a new and unknown question and that it was only a matter of support the Senate chose to vote on it immediately, and with only one dissent.

Another Veneer Plant Planned Near Medford

MEDFORD (U. S. A.)--Another veneer plant is planned for this area, the third to be announced in two months.

This one, still not named, would be owned by the Elk Lumber Co. and the Medford Veneer and Plywood Corp. Peeler logs would come from Elk and the output would go to Medford Veneer.

The planners said construction would cost \$300,000, with operation to begin in late summer. The output is expected to be 12 million square feet of 1-12 inch veneer, produced by 60 men on two shifts.

The Fir-Ply Co. now has a veneer plant under construction, and an unnamed group earlier announced plans for another million and a half dollar plant.
