

Large Shopping Center Announced For Medford

MEDFORD — Plans for a shopping center to cost more than one million dollars were announced here Wednesday.

The center will be located on 22 acres fronting Highway 99 south of the city. The development will begin in the spring or early summer with construction of a Safeway store, one of the four largest in the state, O. R. Blair, Portland, the grocery chains really manager, said.

Later three adjoining structures will be built. The area will have parking space for 800 cars.

Wilson, Radford Grilled About Planned Army Cut

WASHINGTON — Secretary of Defense Wilson and Adm. Arthur Radford ran into critical questions from senators Wednesday about administration plans to cut back manpower in the Army, Navy and Marines.

Chairman Russell (D-Ga.) of the Senate Armed Services Committee, who led the questioning behind closed doors, said later that he believes current conditions "would justify reappraisal" of the plans. He quoted Wilson as testifying

there had been such a reappraisal over Korea last year.

Russell said Wilson told the committee he sees nothing in Russia's shift in government or developments in Formosa to justify a reappraisal of plans to cut the U.S. armed forces.

But the chairman told reporters: "I don't think this is any time to engage in wishful thinking."

Some other senators took a similar tack. Sen. Jackson (D-Wash), after hearing the testimony, commented to newsmen, "I am not satisfied with these cuts."

Hells Canyon Decision Expected In Late Summer

PORTLAND — The Federal Power Commission decision in the Hells Canyon case can be expected in late summer, Jerome K. Rykondall, commission chairman, said here Tuesday.

But, he added, that is not likely to end the case over Idaho Power Co.'s request for a permit to build low dams on the Snake River. The losing side may be expected to appeal, he said.

Rykondall spoke to a meeting of the Washington-Oregon Chamber Managers and Executives.

He said he believed the commission capable of reaching a decision on the merits of the case despite the heat of the public power, private power controversy.

Many Invitations To Be Extended For Bomb Testing

WASHINGTON — State officials, civilian defense observers, industry representatives and newspapermen will be among hundreds invited to witness atomic explosion tests in Nevada in mid-April.

Chairman Lewis L. Strauss of the Atomic Energy Commission and Val Peterson, head of the Federal Civilian Defense Administration Wednesday announced plans for public viewing of the tests which will be utilized for the first time as a civilian defense exercise.

The April "open shot" will be one of a series of 1955 atomic explosion tests due to start this month. Strauss said the exact date for the April exercise will be set about a month in advance.

The joint announcement said observers will include state governors, state and city civil defense officials, representatives of private industry and of the press, radio, television and motion pictures.

Congress Sends GI Bill To President Eisenhower

WASHINGTON — Congress sent to President Eisenhower Wednesday legislation continuing full GI education benefits for all service people who went into uniform before Feb. 1.

Senate passage by voice vote and without debate completed congressional action. The House approved it 366-0 last month.

Nearly 1½ million servicemen and women would benefit to the tune of about 390 million dollars in post-discharge schooling benefits over the next 10 years.
