Fading Royalty Attend Banquet

CASCAIS, Portugal — Much of Europe's fast fading royalty gathered in this little fishing village Thursday for a "family" banquet, inaugurating three days of wedding festivities for Italian Princess Maria Pia and Yugoslav Prince Alexander.

The 30-year-old prince and ex-King Umberto's daughter, 20, will be married in exile Saturday before more than 1,000 European bluebloods. Their romance blossomed last year on the Mediterranean cruise Greece's King Paul put on for scores of royal guests.

Alexander, who works for a Greek shipping firm, is the son of the former Yugoslav regent, Prince Paul.

The Marquis of Lucifero, minister of the House of Savoy in charge of arrangements, said 120 persons were invited to Thursday night's dinner in the Estorial Palace Hotel—"119 of them of fully royal blood." Lucifero himself is the sole exception.

The wedding ceremony will take place in the 500-year-old Church of our Lady of the Assumption.

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Cold Wave H'ts Midsection Of Nation Thursday

A cold wave surged across the nation's midsection Thursday. Temperatures plunged. And, in some areas, gusty winds blew driving snow slowed traffic.

The Weather Bureau at Chicago said it could become the most widespread cold wave of the winter.

Temperatures included: -27 at Dickinson, N. D., -23 at International Falls, Minn., and Williston, N. D., -15 at Duluth, Minn., -11 at Spencer, Iowa, -12 at Minneapolis-St. Paul, -6 at Sioux City, Iowa, -2 at Helena, Mont., -1 at Omaha.

The advancing cold front stretched from the eastern end of the Great Lakes region on the north to southern Texas on the south. It touched off snow squalls in some areas.

Kansas City, Mo., was pelted by snow. A snow storm whipped into Illinois, where the fall was expected to range from one to four inches.

Winds up to 35 to 50 m.p.h. raked Eastern Kansas.

Temperature drops of as much as 30 degrees since Wednesday afternoon were reported.

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
