Practices And Attitudes Of Teachers Studied

A study of the practices and attitudes of primary teachers relating to speech correction is being made throughout Oregon by Leon Mulling. He is on leave of absence as director of the speech center and associate professor of speech at Southern Oregon College.

The study is conducted as a part of his doctoral research at Stanford University. It consists of a listening test for classroom teachers, an interview-inventory about speech methods and an attitude and opinion scale.

According to Professor Mulling, from 70 to 100 teachers will be interviewed and tested in the rural schools of Jackson and Josephine counties, Ashland, Medford, Central Point, Grants Pass, Roseburg, Talent, Eagle Point, Eugene and Portland.

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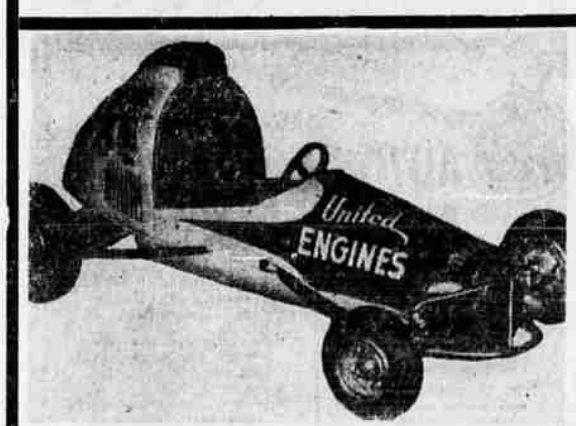
