WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Neuberger (D-Ore.) proposed this week that state agencies and newspapers join federal agencies in abbreviating the state's name as "Oreg."

He said that since the state was 96 years old, it was time that everybody got together on the matter.

"Oreg." is preferred by Dr. Meredith F. Burrill, director of the U. S. Division of Geography, as well as by the Board of Geographic Names and the Government Printing Office, Neuberger said.
