Sutherlin Douglas County Bank Nears End Of Remodeling

Although it will likely be the first of the month before the remodeling work of the Sutherlin Douglas County State Bank will be completed, tellers and book-keeping departments of the bank opened for business last Wednesday in their new departments, while contractors are engaged in remodeling the front part of the building.

Bank customers started using the new entrance on State Street on Wednesday, and when the work is completed modern bank quarters will provide additional space for the continued growth of Sutherlin. This is the first time that any exterior work has been done on the building since it was erected in 1910. The upstairs office room has been taken into use by the bank and the old stairway removed and a new one placed in the rear inside of the building.

The former office of C. P. Smith has also been joined to the building and the old open stairway to the basement has been closed. The exterior stone walls are receiving a coat of light colored paint.
