10-Cent Glass Of Beer May Be On Way Out

SALEM (AP) — The 10-cent glass of beer might become a thing of the past in Oregon.

Gene Rossman, secretary of the Oregon Licensed Beverage Assn., told the House Alcoholic Control Committee Wednesday that the 10-cent glass would disappear if the Legislature passes a bill to increase the \$1.30 a keg beer tax to \$3.10.

Rep. Orval Eaton, Astoria, who introduced the bill, urged its passage on the ground it would help reduce the state's deficit.

Rossman, however, urged that the present tax be reduced.
