11 Persons Burn In Montreal Fire

MONTREAL (AP) — Fire whipped through the top floors of a 75-year-old brick apartment house in the heart of snow-covered Montreal Wednesday night, killing 11 persons and injuring a dozen others.

Firemen combing the ruins early Thursday said there was "only a very slim possibility" more bodies remained to be found. Attempts to identify the dead were left until Thursday. Some were suffocated as they fought through the halls or stairways with flame and smoke.

Others were so badly burned that even their sex could not be determined immediately.

As heavy snow fell, firemen scrambled up ladders to rescue a score of frenzied men and women from wooden balconies and window ledges.

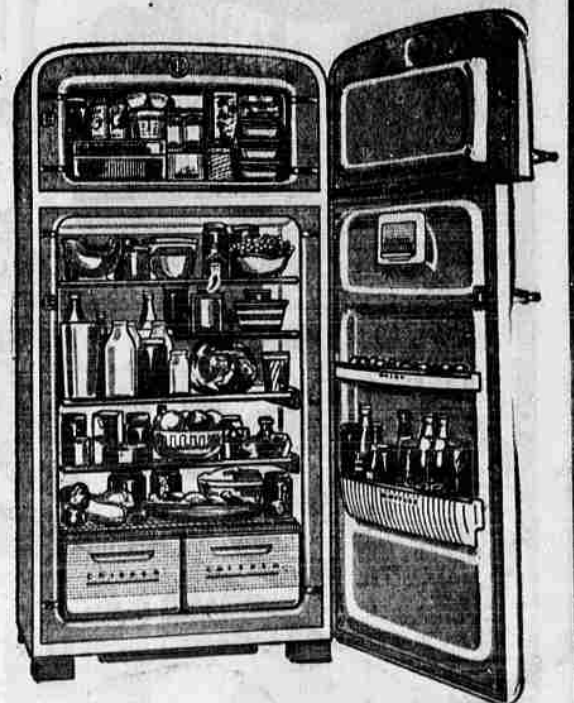

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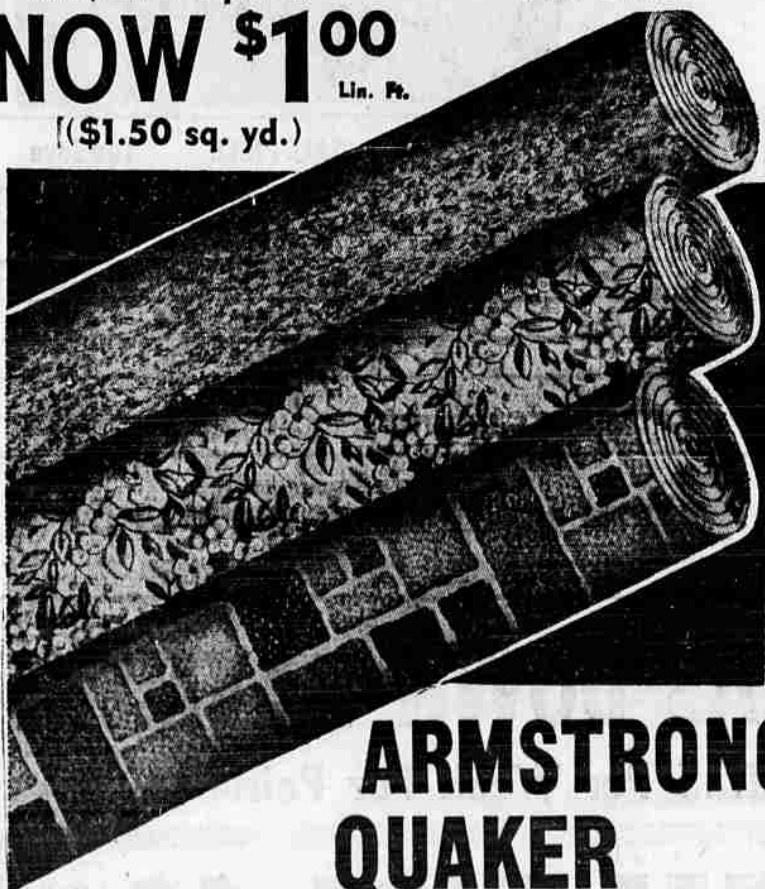
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
