

## Corrupt Practice Act Enforcement Asked For Oregon

PORTLAND (AP) — Oregon needs better enforcement of the corrupt practices act and changes in administrative methods to get it, a committee of the Portland City Club reported Thursday after nearly a year of study.

There has been almost no enforcement of the act, the committee report said, because "the State Elections Division has neither the staff nor the authority" to do the job.

The committee said that it had found a number of violations which had gone undiscovered.

The committee recommended a commissioner of elections with an adequate budget, staff and power to audit campaign reports and enforce the law.

The report will go before the club March 11 for consideration. George W. Friede, attorney and former legislator, was committee chairman. Another former legisla-

tor, Philip S. Hitchcock, also was on the committee.

Among other changes, the committee report recommends that each political candidate have a single agent to report all expenditures in his behalf; that individual contributions be limited on a scale ranging from \$100 for election districts up to \$5,000 for state-wide offices; loans be regarded as contributions; that all candidates file expenditure reports before the election; and that no limit be set on total expenditures.

### Nanchishan Evacuation Said Up To Chinese

WASHINGTON (AP) — A State Department spokesman said Thursday it is strictly up to the Chinese Nationalist government whether to evacuate the coastal island of Nanchishan.

"There has been no United States insistence on the evacuation of Nanchishan," press officer Henry Suydam said.

Under questioning, however, Suydam said he "would be surprised" if the Nationalist government was not informed of the U. S. attitude about the military importance of the island.

It has been reported for several weeks that the United States thought the Nationalists should evacuate Nanchishan as they did the Tachen Islands two weeks ago.

## Psychiatrist Says Mother Who Took Sons' Lives Sane

HOUSTON, Tex. (AP) — A red-haired mother who strangled, dismembered and helped bury the bodies of her two small sons, is "absolutely sane," a psychiatrist said Thursday.

Mrs. Ann Williams, 28, "realizes her guilt and expects to be punished," said Dr. C. A. Dwyer. "She had a rather unhappy childhood," the psychiatrist said. "She was born of poor parents and moved to the hills of Tennessee at an early age."

He indicated that Mrs. Williams, who made an abortive attempt to kill herself with sleeping pills, on the same night she killed her sons, was "running from reality."

He described her as "above average intelligence. . . she has poise and bearing."

Mrs. Williams says she had no accomplice in the slayings. "I did it alone," she told the psychiatrist. "No one else knew about it."

She explained her reason for trying to take her life and the lives of her sons, Calvin, 9, and Conrad, 8.

"I didn't want them to live in poverty like me when I was a child," she said.

Investigators say a bank book found in her apartment showed she had \$1,000 in a Pasadena, Texas, bank.

Dr. Dwyer first examined Mrs. Williams Wednesday night, then a second time Thursday.

### No Plans Contemplated For Leasing Oil Lands

WASHINGTON (AP) — An Interior Department official said Thursday there is no plan to offer "in the near future" any submerged lands off California for federal oil and gas leasing.

This official, who has handled many details in connection with oil and gas lease of submerged lands in the outer continental shelf off Texas and Louisiana, said such plans await Supreme Court action on the long pending question of California's seaward boundary.

The official asked not to be quoted by name.

He said also there has been no indication of interest sufficient to warrant advertising a proposed sale. He said two oil companies have informally inquired about the possibility.

As a general thing, this official said, it is believed that the lands in California's outer continental shelf would be at such depths that it might be a long time before there is much interest in leasing them.

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## Caretaker Testifies Seeing Former Solicitor Running Away From Scene Of Murder

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) — The courthouse caretaker at Phenix City testified Thursday that he saw former circuit solicitor (prosecutor) Arch Ferrell run out of a driveway just a few feet away only a few seconds after A. L. Patterson was murdered.

Ferrell is the second of two defendants to be identified thus far during the Albert Fuller murder trial as having been seen running away near the spot where the anti-vice campaigner was killed last June 18.

An earlier witness told the jury he saw Fuller jump into a waiting automobile and speed away about a minute after he heard three shots fired.

Quinnie Kelley, caretaker at the Russell County courthouse in Phenix City, testified that he saw Ferrell dash out of a driveway behind the post office shortly after he heard three pistol shots. The post office is located half a block from the office building where Patterson was slain as he was getting into his automobile.

Earlier in the day the jury heard testimony linking Fuller with profits from Phenix City's vice empire.

The evidence given Wednesday in the absence of the jury was repeated Thursday after Judge J.

### Hunger-Strike Prisoner Gets 5-Year Prison Term

MOSCOW, Idaho (AP) — William James Manley, who went on a 25-day hunger strike in the Latah County jail after his arrest for armed robbery, was found guilty and sentenced to five years in prison Wednesday.

Manley was arrested in July after a service station here was held up. He refused a court-appointed attorney and his case was postponed. He went on his hunger strike in December.

Two other men arrested with him pleaded guilty.

Manley refused a court-appointed attorney again Wednesday. During course of the trial, Judge Albert J. Graf asked if Manley had any objections to the entering of some evidence. He replied: "Deal me out. I'm not in the game."

WASHINGTON (AP) — Senate and House conferees compromised Thursday on a salary rise of \$8,750 for members of Congress. This would boost their pay from \$15,000 to \$23,750 a year.

Their agreement is subject to ratification by both the Senate and House.

Along with a pay increase for senators and representatives the bill carries increases of \$7,500 to \$10,000 a year for federal judges.

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
