

Progress Noted In Arms Fight, States Russell

WASHINGTON (AP) — Chairman Russell (D-Ga.) of the Senate Armed Services Committee said here today that the "progress" in the race with Soviet Russia to perfect intercontinental missiles.

Russell made the comment to newsmen after Gen. Nathan Twining and Secretary of the Air Force Talbot gave the committee a secret briefing Thursday. Twining is Air Force chief of staff.

Sen. Jackson (D-Wash.), a member of both the Armed Services and Congressional Atomic Energy Committees, listened to the secret

testimony and told reporters: "The Air Force program seems to be coming along in good shape. Our capacity to deliver atomic weapons for retaliatory purposes continues to improve."

Jackson said the "real danger in this field is in the deliverability," and added, "the present so-called atomic stalemate would be broken if the Russians obtain an intercontinental ballistic missile before we do."

"If the Russians do perfect one first, all this talk about bigger hydrogen bombs would be meaningless," Jackson said.

"It is essential to our security that we leave no stone unturned in an effort to perfect the IBM (intercontinental ballistic missile) at the earliest possible date."

Twining indicated to newsmen that tests had been made of "Snark," a long-range guided missile which scientists hope to send in a low level flight for several thousand miles at supersonic speeds.

Twining said that "we are just getting started" with "Atlas," which has been termed the intercontinental ballistic missile. It would be sent up many miles in the air and then dropped on the enemy under special controls.

Both Talbot and Twining listed development of these and other missiles as top priority items for the Air Force.

Marlon Brando Given Foreign Press Award

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — A new Marlon Brando, dapper in a tuxedo, made his Hollywood social debut last week.

Brando, heretofore the leading exponent of the sweat shirt school of acting, accepted an award of the Hollywood Foreign Correspondents' Assn. and the Foreign Press Assn. for the best performance by a dramatic actor in 1954. The association's members are reporters from foreign countries who cover Hollywood.

Brando, whose portrayal of the puny pug in "On the Waterfront" is among the top contenders for an Oscar.

Gregory Peck and Audrey Hepburn were acclaimed as the most popular stars in the 50 nations represented by the associations.

OSC To Train Science Folk

Oregon State College has been picked as one of 24 colleges in the country to help train high school science teachers in a special summer program.

Under the program, a limited number of selected teachers will work as summer research assistants to leading college scientists. They will receive full - expense scholarships.

The program is aimed at stimulating interests of teachers and their students in turn—in scientific and technical careers. The need for science teachers is far outstripping the supply, according to Stanley E. Williamson, head of science education at OSC.

The national program grew out of a western conference held at OSC last year by the National Science Teachers Association. That

USS Congress Name Selected For Super Carrier

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Navy says it wants to name its fifth super carrier the USS Congress—If it can get Congress to put up the money for it.

The Navy has suggested the name in outlining a program to build the carrier and 33 other warships next year. The \$1,300,000,000 program also calls for converting 6 carriers and 22 other warcraft for modern warfare.

A 4,600-ton nuclear-powered radar picket submarine and two other 2,300-ton atomic subs are among proposed new vessels.

Rep. Cannon (D-Mo.), chairman of the House Appropriations Committee, is on record opposing a requested 180 million dollars for the proposed new 60,000-ton Forrestal-type carrier.

How much support Cannon will get is not yet clear.

Chairman Vinson (D-Ga.) says the House Armed Services Committee will open hearings, probably next week, to review the effectiveness of the giant flatboats. Air Force generals sharply attacked their value in bitter congressional hearings in 1949, while advocating all-out production of intercontinental bombers.

The Navy proposal to name the new carrier the Congress was inserted without explanation in a new bill detailing the shipbuilding program, introduced Thursday. Committee officials said the fledgling American Navy in colonial times had a similar named frigate—a small, inshore patrol craft.

The measure calls for construction to start during the year ending in mid-1958 on 13 destroyers, a guided missile submarine and 4 conventional submarines, 9 minesweepers and other small craft.

In addition to the carriers, the Navy said it wants to modernize one heavy and one light cruiser and other craft.

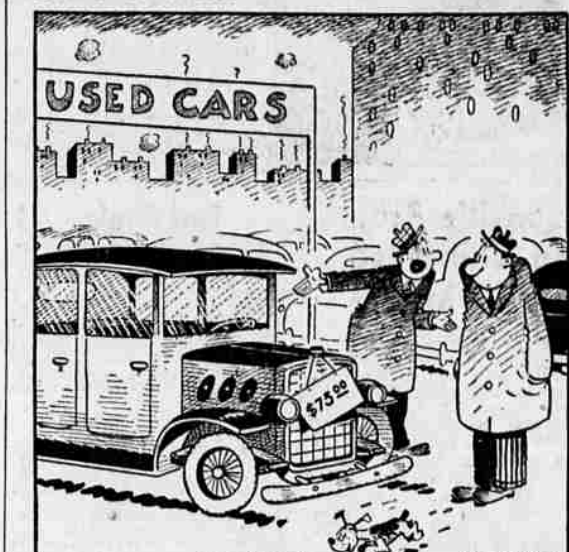
Oregon's Republican Norblad was not recorded as voting.

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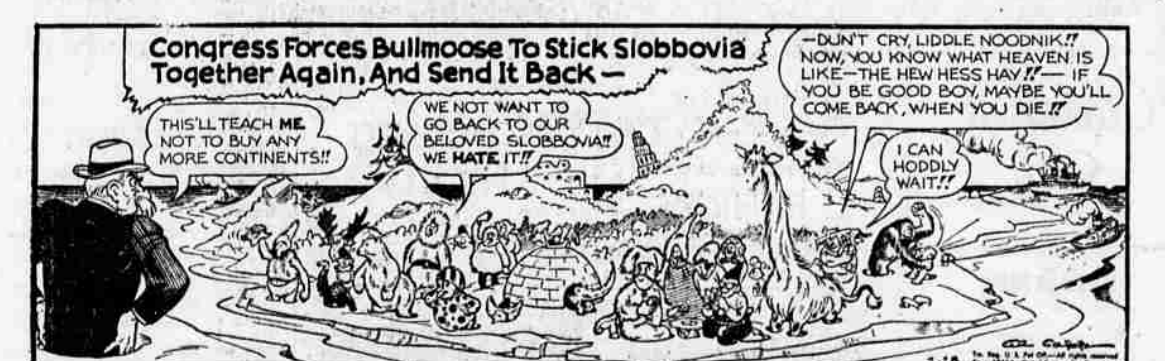

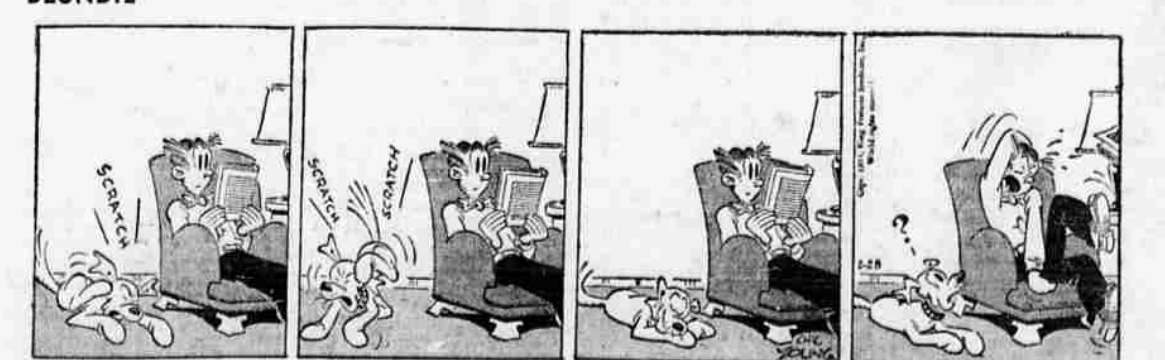
