

Prison Terms Are Ending For Communists Convicted In '49 Conspiracy Trial

DANBURY, Conn. (AP) — Prison terms are ending for most of the 11 top Communists convicted in the memorable nine-month conspiracy trial in 1949.

But they face new trials or, in the case of non-citizens, banishment to foreign lands.

11 Japanese Educated In U.S. Win At Election
TOKYO (AP) — Japan's final election results Monday showed that 11 American-educated candidates for seats in the lower House were elected in Sunday's general election.

They came from such schools as Harvard University, Princeton, Yale, Oregon, Columbia and one woman graduate of Wellesley College.

Several may be appointed to high cabinet or government posts. One of the 11, Naboru Tanikawa, Harvard graduate, died of a heart attack Sunday after he received word of his election victory.

Committee Hits Gas Regulation

WASHINGTON (AP) — A presidential commission has slapped at federal regulation of natural gas before it flows into interstate commerce. The commission also proposed keeping imports of fuel oil at present levels despite demands by some congressmen and coal interests for sharp cutbacks.

The stand was taken by a group of cabinet officers in a report on a lengthy study of energy supplies and resources policy requested by President Eisenhower last summer.

On natural gas, the commission indirectly took exception to a Supreme Court decision last June by saying: "We believe the federal government should not control the production, gathering, processing or sale of natural gas prior to its entry into an interstate transmission line."

In the controversial Phillips Petroleum case, the Supreme Court last June gave the Federal Power Commission (FPC) authority to regulate the price of all natural gas which moves in interstate commerce—from the wellhead to the consumer.

On coal, the commission concluded that "in the interest of national defense, crude and residual (fuel) oil imports be kept in the proportion that they bore in 1954 to domestic production."

In proposing to continue this balance, the commission also said any substantial increase in imports might result in a domestic fuel industry "so impaired as to endanger the orderly industrial growth which assures the military and civilian supplies and reserves that are necessary to the national defense."

In this connection, the commission took note of the depressed state of the coal industry and recommended various steps for its improvement.

It said "serious unemployment and business distress" exist in the coal industry and recommended that an interdepartmental committee continue to develop programs to alleviate these conditions.

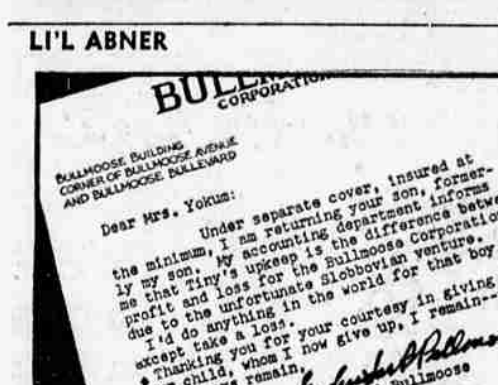

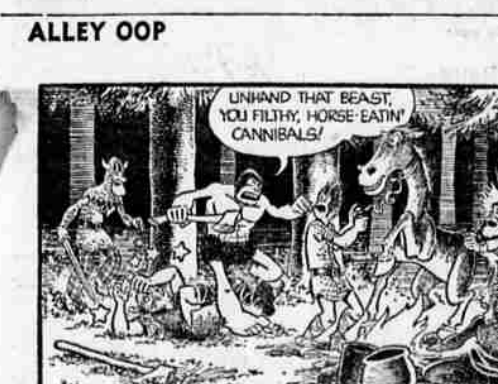
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
