Supreme Court Denies Hearing In Murder Case

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Supreme Court Monday denied a hearing to Barbara Graham, John A. Santo and Emmett R. Perkins, Californians who faced execution for the murder of Mrs. Mabel Monahan of Burbank, Calif.

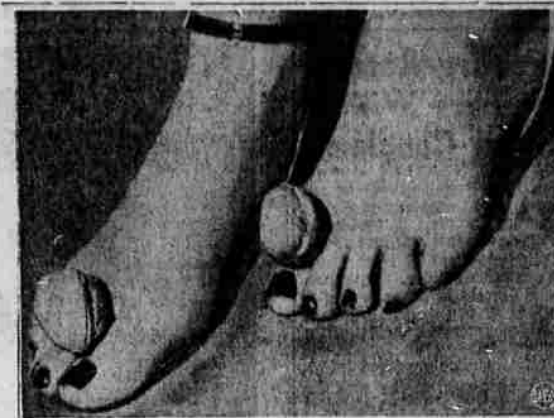
They were to have died in the state's gas chamber last Dec. 3, but stays were granted by Justice Douglas to permit them to file the appeal acted on Monday.

The three asserted in the appeal that "publicity in the newspapers, on the radio and television, was so damaging, both prior to and during the murder trial, as to prevent a fair trial."

They were found guilty in Los Angeles County Superior Court on Oct. 13, 1933. The California Supreme Court affirmed the Superior Court on Aug. 11, 1934.

ELKHEAD HEU PLANS PLANT SALE

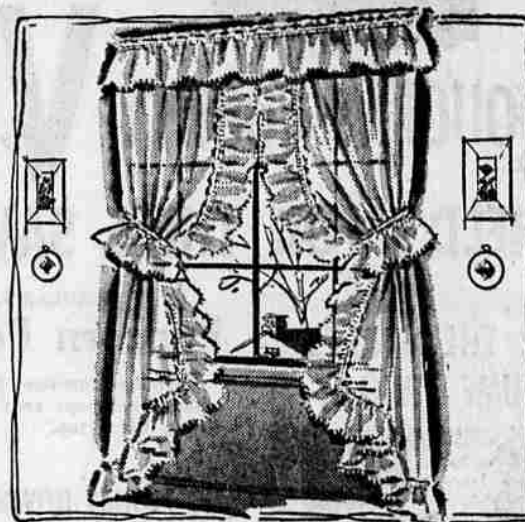

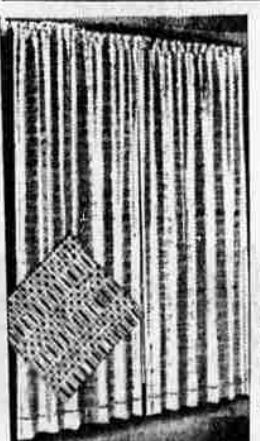
