Rayburn Would Scrap Farm Plan

WASHINGTON (AP) — Speaker of the House Rayburn (D-Tex.) promised early House action Wednesday on legislation to scrap the administration's farm program and restore rigid high price supports on major crops.

It promised a hot fight in the House, which last year overrode its Agriculture Committee and voted for flexible price supports in a victory for the administration. Rayburn, who favors ditching the flexible program, told newsmen he would schedule House action on a new farm bill at the earliest reasonable time. He indicated this might be week after next.

The Agriculture Committee Tuesday approved a bill to support five basic crops—wheat, rice, corn, cotton and peanuts—at 90 per cent of parity.

Present law provides flexible supports this year between 82½

and 90 per cent of parity on these crops. Next year, unless Congress takes some new action, the price support floor drops to 75 per cent. Parity is a calculated price declared by law to give the farmer a fair return on his commodities in relation to his costs.

Legislative Committee TV Hearing Canceled

SALEM (AP) — A legislative committee hearing on educational television was canceled because no one appeared to speak except Sen. Robert D. Holmes, Gearhart, sponsor of the bill.

Sen. Gene L. Brown, Grants Pass, chairman of the Ways and Means Subcommittee that was to have held the hearing, asked the dozen persons in the room if anybody wanted to speak.

Corvallis Lumber Co. Announces It Will Quit

CORVALLIS (AP) — This city's largest single private business, the Corvallis Lumber Co., is quitting.

William Swindells, president, said the firm's sawmill will be closed "in the very near future" because of a lack of "an adequate supply of suitable logs."

The company employs 175 at a monthly payroll of \$68,000. There has been a lumber mill at the plant's site since 1908.

The firm is a subsidiary of the Willamette National Lumber Co., which is headquartered at nearby Dallas.

Weyerhaeuser Options Property For Pulp Plant

ABERDEEN, Wash. (AP) — The Weyerhaeuser Timber Co., proposing a pulp mill development, has taken a 90-day option to 850 acres of Cosmopolis waterfront property owned by the Ullman interests, R. G. Ullman, Sr., and R. J. Ullman Jr. announced.

The property is located on both sides of the Chehalis River and fronts on the natural deepwater section at Cosmopolis, southeast of here. It will be subjected to exhaustive and extensive tests to determine suitability of the area for a big pulp mill, yard operation, roads, extension of railway spur track, dock facilities and other apurtenances.

The Weyerhaeuser company, in addition to taking the option on the Ullman property, also is investigating several other possibilities. C. D. Weyerhaeuser, of the executive offices at Tacoma, told the Aberdeen Daily World. Most of the investigative work is being handled by Howard W. Morgan of the firm's pulp operations staff.

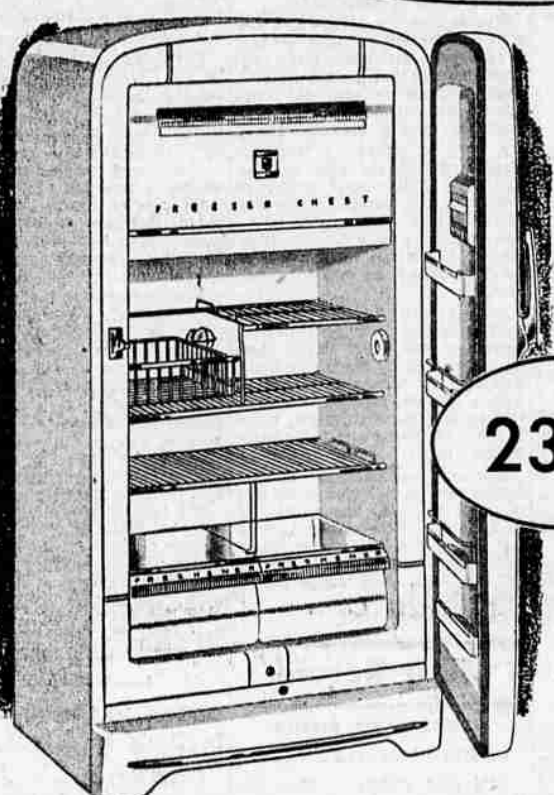

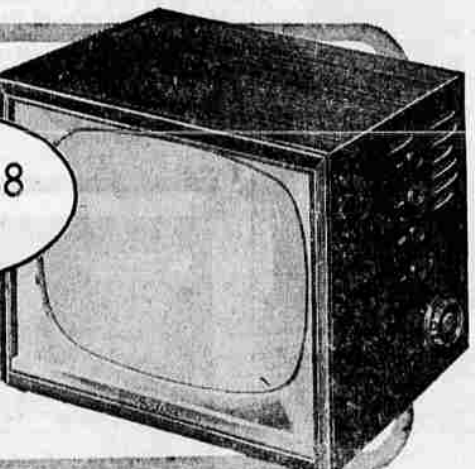

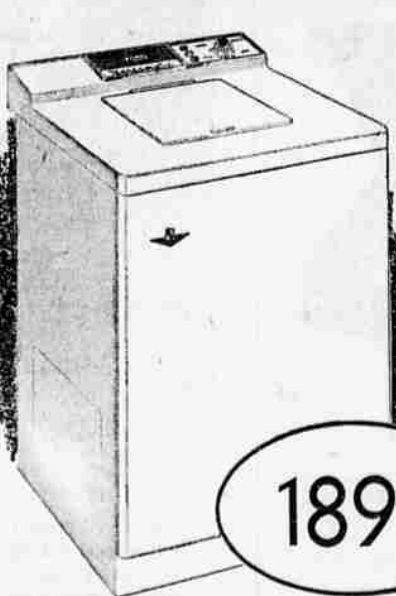
