

Gasoline Dealers Seek To Stop Price Wars

EUGENE (AP) — The Oregon Gasoline Dealers Assn. is trying to find a way to stop gasoline price wars that have flared in several areas recently.

Some 80 dealers from throughout the state met here and authorized their attorney Walter H. Evans Jr. of Portland, "to see what steps are planned."

He said those attending had de-

nounced the policy of one major oil company which operates what he called consignment stations. The company, owning these stations, is able to set the price of gasoline sold there. Frequently, he said, this price is lower than the prevailing rate and a retail price war results.

Other dealers, have to cut prices to meet competition, then suffer financial losses, Evans said.

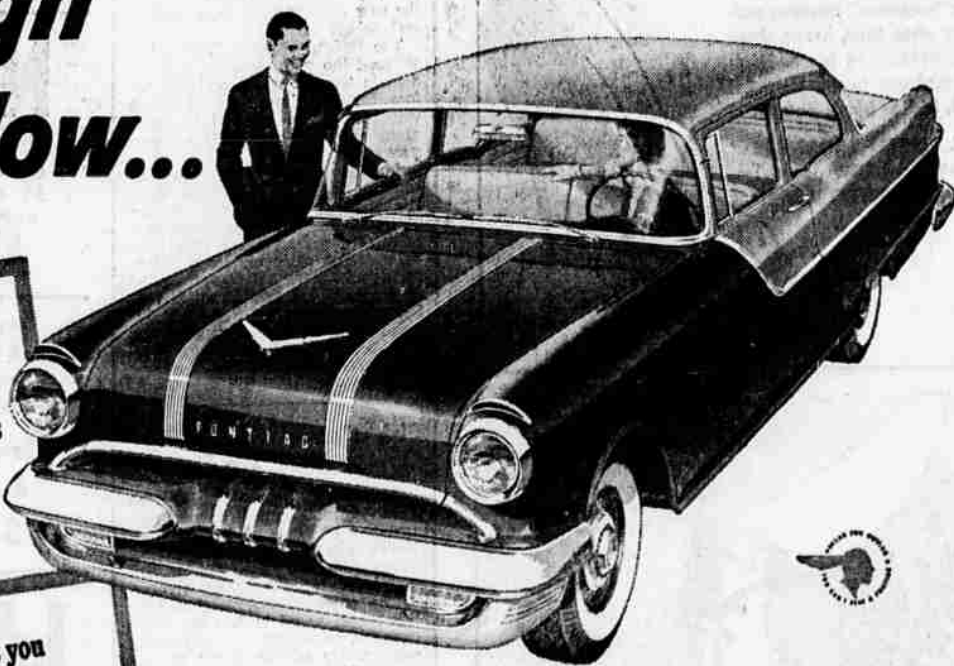

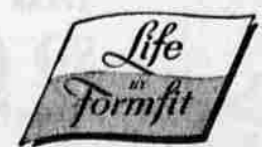
