A Russian police guard was wounded in an attempt to stop the man, who was disarmed by embassy attaches and turned over to Soviet police.

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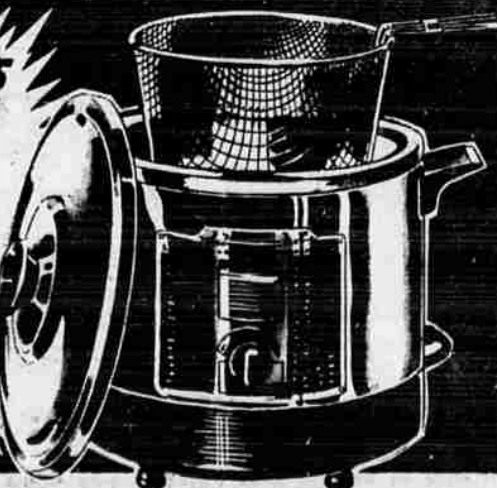
