U.S.-Nationalist Joint War Action In Preparation

TAIPEI, Formosa (AP)—Preparations for a joint U. S. Nationalist Chinese command in case of war with Red China reached the talking state this week.

Sources who should know described as premature reports that machinery for such a joint command had been erected.

They conceded, however, that measures for closer coordination to cope with all eventualities had been discussed and presumably would be put into effect to meet any situation.

It appeared safe to assume, as the U. S. 7th Fleet commander, Vice Adm. Alfred M. Pride re-joined his fleet after surveying the situation here since March 2, that this would be the setup if Red China triggers a war:

1. Americans would command air and naval operations.
2. A nationalist would command ground fighting.
3. Only Nationalist ground forces would be committed. Washington has made plain repeatedly that intervention would depend on

events.
4. If events lead to an American decision to help the Nationalists defend the offshore islands of Quemoy and Matsu, it is believed here that the United States would provide logistical support as well as air and naval cover. The Communists declare they will liberate the islands. The Nationalists insist they will fight to defend them, with or without American help.

ATHENS, Greece (AP)—A U.S. Navy mail plane crashed into the sea off Athens Thursday. The U.S. Embassy said the two crewmen apparently were killed. The tail of the wreckage was spotted 50 yards from the shore, about 13 miles from Athens, police authorities said.

BERLIN (AP)—A parcel addressed to Carl-Hubert Schwennicke, West Berlin head of the anti-Communist Free Democratic Party, exploded in his office Thursday while he was at a city parliament session. His secretary and a messenger were injured.
