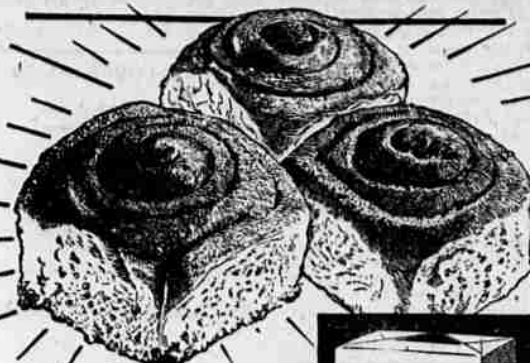


FATALITY NO. 1
