Old Growth Douglas Fir Sale Brings Record \$61

CORVALLIS (AP) — Seven million board feet of old growth Douglas fir brought a record shattering bid of \$61 a thousand in a Siuslaw National Forest auction here.

The high bid, by Valselt Lumber Co., was the highest ever made for Siuslaw timber. It was more than double the \$29.10 appraisal and far above the old record of \$38 paid two years ago by Spaulding Pulp & Paper Co. of Newberg.

The stand adjoins Valselt holdings on the north.

However, other firms too were eager for the fine stand. Linn Plywood Co. went to \$60.75 before dropping out. M and M Wood Working and Portland Manufacturing Co. also made offers.

The tract includes 1,900,000 board feet of Western hemlock. It went at the appraisal price of \$34.40 a thousand.

Dog, Cat Chase Causes Confusion In John Day

Senate Committee Backs Lower-Age Voting Bill

SALEM (AP) — The Senate Resolution Committee here has recommended approval of a proposal that would submit to the voters a constitutional amendment to lower the voting age from 21 to 18.

The committee held a hearing Saturday on the resolution. Teenage speakers were divided in their views.

The committee also decided to report another proposed constitutional amendment to the Senate with a recommendation that it be referred to the Joint Ways and Means Committee. The bills would appropriate \$2500 for an interim committee to study and recommend revisions in the state military system.

Sen. Gene L. Brown, Grants Pass, said Oregon's National Guard is operating under archaic procedures. He cited a constitutional provision that enlisted men may elect their own officers as an example of outmoded regulations.
