Norman Wilson of Los Gatos, Calif., will be kenneled here shortly after April 1. They will be available for manhunts and searches anywhere in the state.

Wilson arrived here late this week to prepare a home for his family and the hounds. He will begin work soon as a forester for the Folk-Benton district of the State Board of Forestry.

The position was offered to Wilson after his hounds solved the disappearance of the missing Zeisler family in the mountains west of Dallas last fall. They amazed skeptical observers by leading the searchers to the three bodies two weeks after the family entered the dense woods on an ill-fated deer hunt.

Shortly after, Wilson brought the hounds to Oregon again after a Hillsboro banker had disappeared. They unerringly led searchers to a spot on the bank of the Tualatin River a few feet from where the body was located.

Following these achievements,

F. M. Henderson, Polk-Benton district warden, offered Wilson the local position with the understanding that he may take the hounds to assist on manhunts and searches when needed.

Senate Bill Makes More Pay For DAs Possible

SALEM (AP) — After an hour's debate, the Senate completed legislative action Saturday on a bill to let counties give additional salaries to their district attorneys and deputies.

The salaries now are paid by the state.

The final vote was 19-8, with objectors claiming the bill would do away with uniformity of the salaries.

Multnomah County now has the right to grant additional salaries to these officers. The bill originally would have added only Lane County, but it was amended in committee to apply to all counties.

MT. ANGEL (AP) — A man wearing a Halloween mask gave employees of the Mt. Angel branch of the U. S. National Bank a brief scare Friday.

Manager James Fournier said the masked man, his hat pulled down over his face and topcoat collar pulled up, first peered in a window, then approached the door. Several customers and employees could be seen inside, and the man walked to a car he had parked next door and drove away.

Sabbath Law Violation Draws \$5 Fine For GM

NEW YORK (AP) — A fine for violating an 1881 Sabbath law banning most work on Sunday has reduced the assets of the General Motors Corp. from \$5,130,093.595 to \$5,130,093.590.

The corporation pleaded guilty and paid a \$5 fine Friday for allowing 78 employees to work Sunday, March 6.

The employees, working on overtime pay rates, were busy getting out stock certificates on GM's new \$25-million-dollar issue to raise new capital.

The old law, although banning most Sunday work, permits sale of meals, certain foods and such items as souvenirs, newspapers, gasoline, drugs and surgical instruments.
