GLENDALE CLUB INITIATES MEMBERS

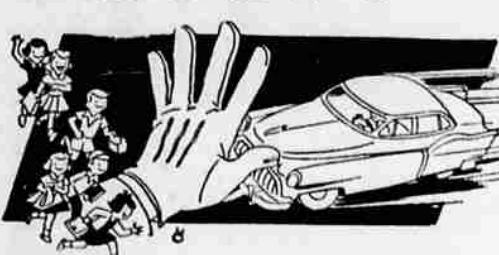
