Title Match Slated On Sutherlin Mat

A junior heavyweight title match between Champ Thomas and Jack Garibaldi features Thursday night's wrestling card on the Eagles mat program in Sutherlin at the Legion Hall.

Rocky Marciano Moves Training To California

GROSSINGER, N. Y. (AP) — Heavyweight champion Rocky Marciano headed here Monday and headed for California, where he will begin serious work out for his May 18 title defense against Don Cockcroft of England in San Francisco.

Here in his Catskill Mountain haunt, he has been training "lightly" for more than two months. This consisted of boxing 27 rounds with his sparring partner, doing hundreds of miles of roadwork and whipping through the equivalent of another 100 rounds with the punching bag. He weighed 206 pounds when he started his sessions on Jan. 11. Just before the final check on his equipment, he stepped on the scales and they showed 191 pounds — four pounds over his best fighting weight.

The Brockton Blockbuster will set up headquarters in Calistoga, Calif., 73 miles from San Francisco about six weeks before the fight.

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) — Two former college stars — Cliff Hagan of Kentucky and Robert Rousey of Kansas State — led defending champion Andrews Air Force Base of Maryland to a 110-77 victory over Hill AFB of Utah in the first round of the worldwide Air Force basketball tournament Monday night.

Hagan, an All-America, scored 26 points and Rousey 27 in Andrews' 51st straight victory of the season. In other games Monday, Nagoya Japan, defeated Francis E. 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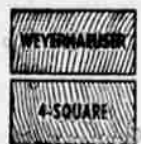
