Measure Would Prevent Retail Selling Of Gas

SALEM, Ore. — Gov. Patterson signed into law here a bill to prevent new gas pipeline companies from selling gas at retail.

It provides that no company could serve an area already being served unless it got a permit from the state public utilities commission.

And such permits couldn't be granted unless the existing company refused to give service.

The bill is designed to protect existing gas companies from retail competition from the natural gas companies which will bring gas from Canada and the Southwest.
