Forest Service Timber Cut To Be Increased 10 Per Cent

SPOKANE (AP) — The Intermountain Logging Conference was told Tuesday the timber cut on national forest lands during the current fiscal year will total about 6 billion board feet.

Ira J. Mason, chief of the division of timber management for the United States Forest Service, said this is an increase of 10 per cent over fiscal 1954 and that there are plans for a 6.23 billion board feet cut in the next fiscal year.

"For the calendar year 1954, the cut was 5.8 billion board feet, an advance of 400 million in spite of the loss from last summer's lumber strike," he said.

He told a Chamber of Commerce luncheon later that a little more than 25 per cent of the 5.8 billion cut was "in the area tributary to Spokane — Montana, eastern Ore-

gon, eastern Washington and Idaho."

"From this cut Uncle Sam got about 15 million dollars into the treasury and spent about 1 1/2 million to get it."

Edward Woolley, director of the Bureau of Land Management, told the loggers that his agency is considering a proposal to sell timber from forest lands by a combination of sealed and oral bidding.

"Substantially, this would require the submission of sealed bids with a provision for throwing the sale open to oral bidding if more than one sealed bid is received for a

given tract, or if no sealed bids are received," he said.

The idea would be tried for 60 days to determine if it's workable. Robert Neils, an assistant superintendent of the J. Neils Lumber Co. of Libby, Mont., said loggers are not able to make any long-range plans for cutting timber now from specified areas because of the infestation of the spruce beetle.

"Each spring we have to hurry into the forests to find what the beetles have done and then we

have to build access roads to get out and salvage timber they have hit," he said.

Mason said the largest portion of road funds appropriated for this fiscal year is going into such access roads.

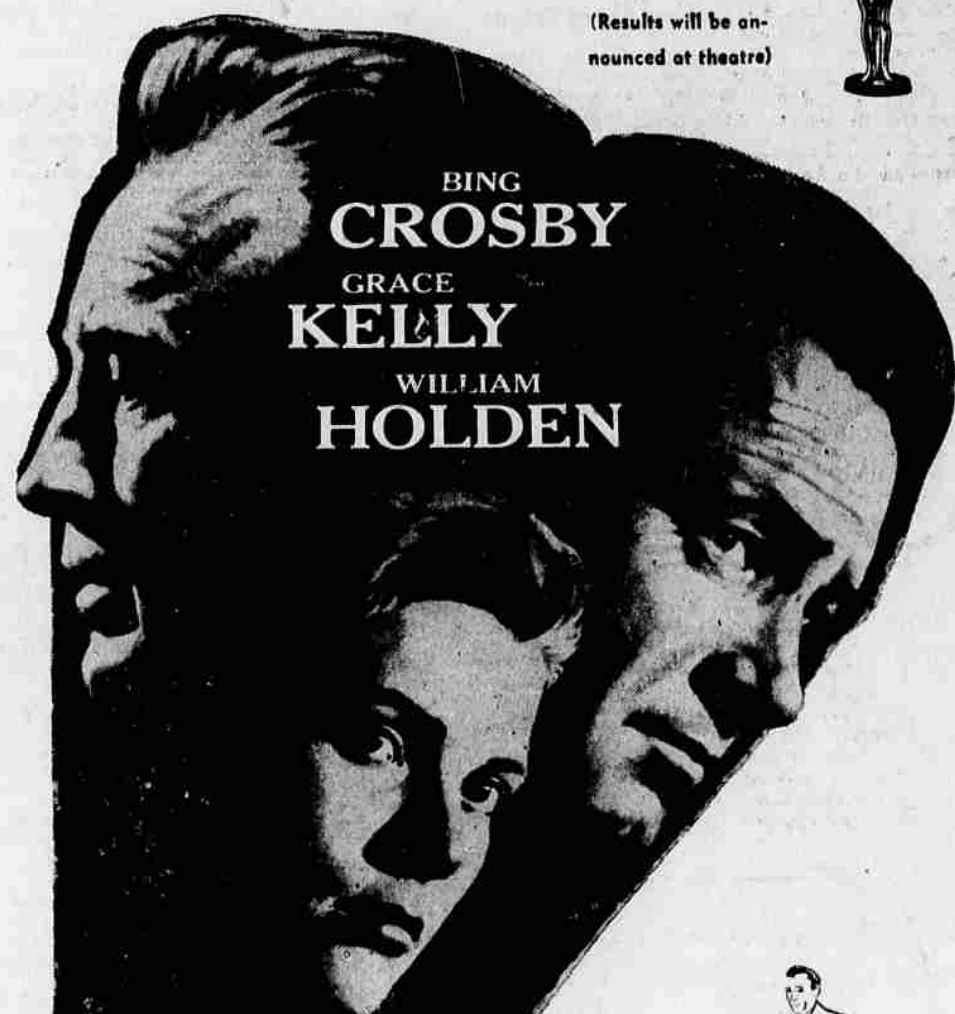
