

VA Hospital Grounds Along Harvard Improved

Extensive changes and landscaping on the Veterans Hospital grounds along Harvard Avenue are continuing, with a fence row being cleared and shrubbery being removed near the street.

Removal of old shrubbery will provide better visibility and easier

access to the VA cemetery area. As soon as weather permits, a new road will be built from Harvard Avenue direct to the cemetery, officials say.

About 5,000 trees have been planted in the area during the last two years. Recently, many 2-year-old seedling pine and fir trees were set out.
