

Oldest Living Graduate Of West Point Passes

PORTLAND (AP) — Funeral services for Col. C. E. Dentler, who was believed to have been the oldest living graduate of West Point until his death Saturday, will be held Wednesday. He was 95.

Dentler was born April 9, 1859, at Pittston, Pa., and was graduated from the Army academy in 1884. In 1894 he became the first regular Army commandant of cadets at Oregon State College.

His 42 years of active service included the Indian campaigns of Arizona in 1891-92; the Spanish American War, 1898; Philippine Insurrection, 1898-1903; Cuban Pacification, 1906; China, 1912; and World War I, 1918.

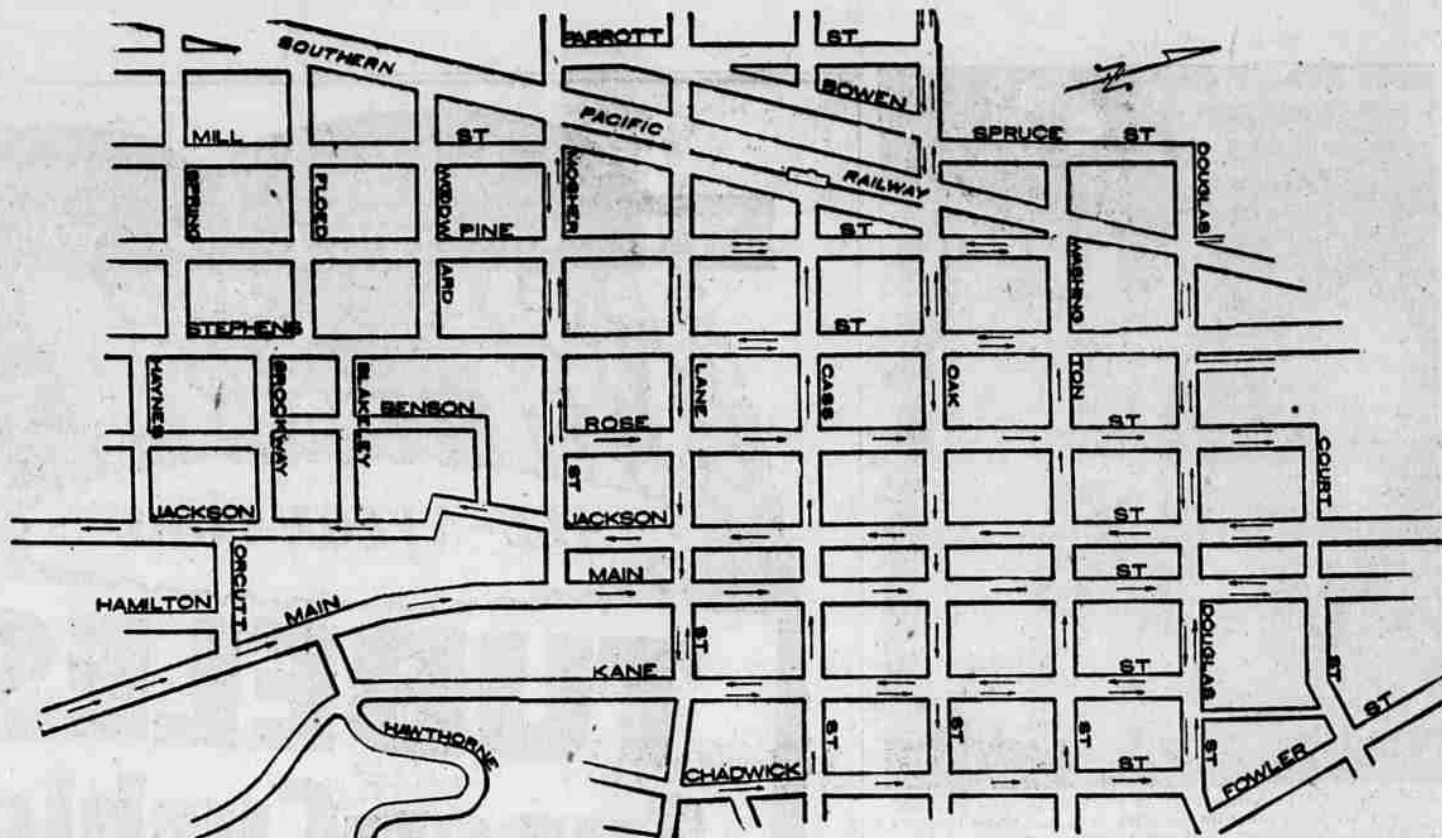
Col. Dentler retired in 1923.
