Water Resources Measure Opposed

EUGENE (AP) — Don P. Allen of Eugene, state president of the Frank Walton League, wants a public hearing in order to oppose a water resources measure now before the Legislature.

He said Wednesday he was calling on 30 chapters of the League to be alert to what he called a threatened "backward step in fish and wildlife conservation."

The measure recently passed the House with only six dissenting votes. It then went to the Senate's Natural Resources Committee.

Allen said Waltonians realize "the necessity of sound water policy" and are in general agreement with

such policy established with the framework of section 10 of House Bill 25. However, recommendations have almost completely been ignored."

Existing protections, Allen said, would be wiped out if the bill were to pass as it stands now.
