Sinclair Oil Leases Land In Southwest Benton Co.

CORVALLIS, Ore. — Oil company leases covering 540 acres of private land in Benton County have been filed here. They are by Sinclair Oil and Gas Co., Tulsa, the same company which Wednesday was reported to have leased 13,025 acres of state owned land in Western Oregon.

The Benton county private land leases are in the Alsea-Lobster Valley area in the southwest part of the county.

The state land leased is in Douglas, Coos and Lane counties.

Lockheed Corp. Producing New Training Plane

BURBANK, Calif. (AP) — Lockheed Aircraft Corp. has announced that production is under way for the Navy of a jet training plane equipped with an air blowing device that makes possible shorter landings and takeoffs.

The aircraft company also said in its announcement Wednesday night that the Navy plane will be the first two-place jet trainer to be used on both seagoing carriers and on land.

The company said the plane, known as the T2 V-1, is "a milestone in aeronautical engineering" because of the air blowing development. Lockheed engineers said highly compressed air is diverted from the jet's engine into a tube which runs inside the trailing edge of the wing. The air is blown at high speed through slots in the tube and out over the wing flap and aileron.

This blowing, said the announcement, tends to make the normal flow of air over the wing hug the skin surface, thus increasing the planes lift and delaying any tendency to stall.

Lockheed said the plane is now undergoing tests and production is progressing.

Jacobs rushed home with her and opened the dryer. The cat, "tiger," his fur literally standing on end but still alive, left the dryer in a streak which lasted through several back yards.

Mrs. Jacobs said "tiger" apparently crawled into the dryer Wednesday when she put in a load of children's clothing. She estimated he had been in there 40 minutes at a "high heat" setting.

He returned at nightfall, "somewhat sensitive to the touch," Jacobs said.

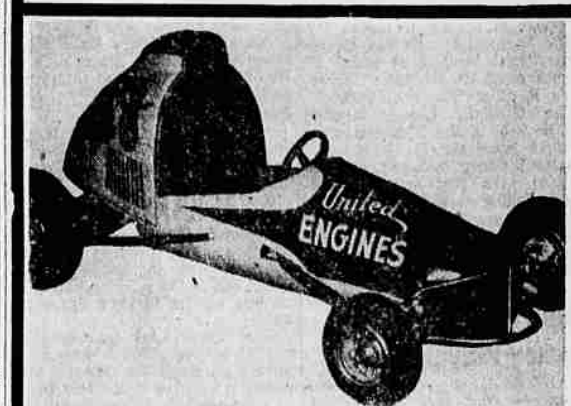

Belgium, Luxembourg Ratify Paris Agreements

BRUSSELS, Belgium (AP) — Belgium and Luxembourg completed parliamentary ratification Wednesday of the Paris agreements for rearmament of West Germany.

That left only two of the 15 nations involved—Denmark and The Netherlands—still to wind up action on the pact.

The Belgian Senate approved the agreements 142-2. A pair of Communists made up the opposition. The Belgian House voted its approval Jan. 20.

In neighboring Luxembourg, the single chamber parliament ratified the agreements 48-3. Again the Communists made up the opposition.

The only formalities remaining are signing of the draft bills by the rulers—Belgium's King Baudouin and Luxembourg's Grand Duchess Charlotte—and publication in the official gazettes.

Fireball Seen In Sky South Of Eureka Area

EUREKA, Calif. (AP) — The sheriff's office said Thursday motorists reported seeing what appeared to be a fireball streaking across the sky to the south between here and San Francisco.

The first report came at 12:57 a.m. A motorist described it as "a green fireball with a green tail" and added that it looked like a fiery "Christmas tree ornament."

The reports in Northern California followed similar accounts from New Mexico of fireballs seen Tuesday. Three separate fiery objects were seen there, described as varying in color.
