

Babb And Days Creek Beat Irish On Riddle's New Oval

Riddle began competitive track on its new track Thursday afternoon, but a more experienced Days Creek team led by state champion Bobby Babb emerged winner by a score of 68 1/2 to 37 1/2.

Babb was the day's individual high scorer with first in the discus and the javelin, a first on the winning relay team and a second in the 180-yard hurdles.

His performances included a javelin toss of 162-5 and a discus throw of 134-11.

In another notable performance, Dick Hyatt vaulted nine feet for the winners.

There was no mile event and there was no high hurdle event. The two teams meet again next Wednesday at Riddle.

Tom Mason leaves to coach at Days Creek next fall from what appears to be a highly promising situation at Yoncalla.

Yoncalla never knew a bad season in Mason's three-year stint there, but the Eagles were the league's most consistent first division school in all sports with fewest championships.

Mason's state B track title team in 1953 came in his finest hour.

THE EAGLES will probably never know a bad season. But who knows about the championships?

Here is the way the expected team returns stacked up for next year at that school: There will be 15 returning football lettermen and three losses; 12 returning varsity basketball lettermen and two losses; (the entire 15-letterman javayee basketball team returns after losing one game all season; by two points to Oakland, and beating both Drain and Sutherlin); there are two seniors on the present baseball and track teams.

One of the losses in all four of the sports is the guy that makes picking all-star teams easy—Phil Blomquist. Losing him may prove more costly to Yoncalla fortunes for a while. It's a good thing there are so many returning.

Mason goes from a school with an enrollment of 110 to one which has 86. He will hold a similar position of coach and social studies teacher at Days Creek.

"I had a very nice group of boys to work with and like he community," commented the blond-headed Mason, "I have hopes of developing some pretty good teams at Days Creek."
