

Nez Perce Indians Will Get Fisheries Loss Pay

LEWISTON, Idaho (AP)—The Nez Perce Indians of Washington, Idaho and Oregon would receive about 6½ million dollars under a government formula to compensate for their loss of fisheries by the construction of The Dalles Dam, a spokesman said this week.

Ted Little, attorney for the Nez Perce tribe, said the tribe is negotiating for a settlement on its Celilo Falls fishing rights on the same formula used in other agreements.

A contract signed in Washington Wednesday gives the Yakima Indians \$15,019,640 for the fisheries they will lose.

The formula used in that settlement, Little said, will bring the 6½ million dollars to members of the Nez Perce tribe located in the Lewiston valley, at Nespelem, Wash. and near Joseph, Ore.

The Army Engineers are expected to make the first \$600,000 payment to the Yakimas within 30 days, the remainder when the dam is closed next year.
