

Trial Date Set For Triple Killer

TACOMA, Wash. (AP) — The first degree murder trial of Harvey John Collins, confessed triple-slayer, was set Monday by Superior Judge Hardin Soule for June 27.

Prosecutor John J. O'Connell estimated the trial would last at least 10 days.

Collins, 29-year-old war hero, is charged with first degree murder and first degree assault for a Samur-sword attack a month ago on an elderly motel operator and his wife.

Andrew Stolen, 74, was slashed and stabbed to death. His wife, Anna, 67, was severely wounded. After his arrest Collins, a dairy worker at nearby Puyallup, signed confessions that he also killed a service station operator near here in a February holdup, and strangled and beat a Louisville, Ky., waitress to death in May 1953.

The victim of the Kentucky slaying was Mrs. Edna Iona Hall, 37, mother of five children.

Collins, who was an Army captain at the time, said in his confession he attacked Mrs. Hall when she rebuffed his advances in a parked car near Ft. Knox, Ky.

Roy Birdwell, 33, Houston, was returning from visiting a sick brother at Carthage. At the same time, a third brother, Troy Lee Birdwell, also of Houston, was en route to Carthage.

Troy Lee stopped at a store near here. As he stepped from his car, Roy drove into view.

The brothers waved. Roy started to cross the highway toward the store.

His car collided with another. Roy was killed, a sister critically hurt.

Burglar Springs Fancy Explanation For Grab

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — Three men tried to rifle the cash register of a gasoline station Saturday but were foiled by K. O. Burnett, Oklahoma City motorcycle officer, who works there part time.

Officers later quoted one of the thieves as saying: "I didn't intend to steal the money. I was just looking at it. I accidentally hit the cash register and when I regained my senses I had the money in my hand."

Bodies Of Two Missing Children Found In River

SAGINAW, Mich. (AP) — The bodies of Charles Schram, 10, and his sister Georgeanna, 8, were found in the Flint River Saturday.

The children were last seen Feb. 23 playing on a frozen riverbank behind their home. Their disappearance set off an intensive two-week search. Brush and ice had concealed the bodies.

Coroner Richard F. Gugel said he believed the children had drowned but he ordered a post-mortem.

NW Turkey Growers Facing Bad Situation

PULLMAN (AP) — The Pacific Northwest turkey business is foul—which may sound like a pun but is no joke to growers who gathered at Washington State College for a weekend conference.

John Miller, WSC extension service poultry specialist, told the growers the ratio of their feed costs as compared to the price they receive for their turkeys is the worst since 1937. He said it is 18 per cent poorer than last year.

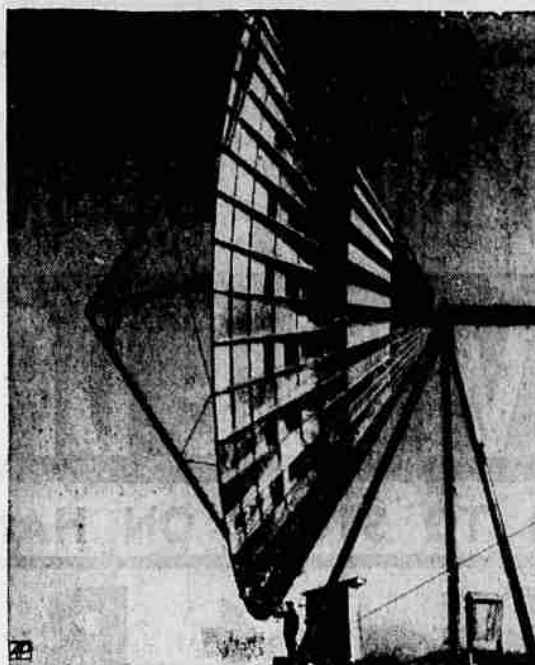
Miller saw the possibility of slight improvement in the cost-price squeeze by the end of the year, depending on a cutback in production.

'Shakedown' Cruise Set For Atomic Sub

WASHINGTON (AP) — The atomic submarine Nautilus will head out to sea soon to test her speed and stealth against the best of the Navy's antisubmarine forces on a "shakedown" cruise of thousands of miles.

The big, 3,000-ton nuclear submarine came back into New London, Conn., late last week from a demonstration and test conducted for a Navy survey board which approves new ships for acceptance in the operating fleet.

The Nautilus' crew already has sailed her more than 3,000 miles and dived almost 100 times. But most of this has been to test her mechanical performance.

Heavy Storage Of Apples Hikes Advertising Plan

WENATCHEE (AP) — With some 6,000 carloads of fruit still in storage, Washington State apple shippers and growers have stepped up their nation-wide advertising program by dipping into reserve funds to the tune of \$35,000.

Apple Commission Manager Harold Coppel said Monday that three seasons of short production have now used up the commission's backlog and growers are being asked to vote an additional one-cent per box for the state apple advertising assessment.

If the April 23 mail ballot receives a majority vote among the state's 5,000 growers, the per box assessment will be raised from three to four cents on the 1955 crop, he said.

Coppel said growers have found that advertising and promotion is vitally necessary if retailers are to move Washington apples at the higher prices needed to offset freight costs to major markets.

Storage Still Heavy — Meanwhile, the Wenatchee Valley Traffic Assn., reported that 6,041 cars of apples remained in state storages on April 1. This compared with 6,378 in 1954 and only 5,068 cars in 1953.

Prices have shown a steady upward movement all through the season, handlers said with Winesaps, the main remaining variety, now ranging between \$4.35 and \$4.50 per box, f.o.b.

Shippers pointed out that the advertising and promotion campaigns must be kept up on assisting the retailers on through the spring months, for an orderly close to the marketing season in June.

They said the short crops have meant high prices for the fruit and a resulting restriction in markets. It has taken all season long for Washington apples to finally break into the important Eastern seaboard marketing area, shippers said.

Green Trading Stamp Originator Dies At 84

SEATTLE (AP) — Ernest Hutchinson, credited with originating the green-stamp merchandise exchange system, died in a hospital here Sunday after a week's illness. He was 84.

Hutchinson, whose family said he conceived the idea of the stamps in Battle Creek, Mich., before the turn of the century, moved here in 1903. Under the plan, green stamps were given with purchases at retail outlets. The stamps later were redeemable for merchandise.
