

Austrian Begins Talks With Russia On Treaty

MOSCOW, (AP)—Austrian Chancellor Julius Raab and Soviet Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov began formal conversations in the Kremlin Tuesday on an Austrian independence treaty.

Raab was accompanied to the meeting by Deputy Chancellor Adolf Schaerf, Foreign Minister Leopold Figl and Deputy Foreign Minister Bruno Kreisky. Also present were two Austrian technical experts.

Before the opening of political talks, the visiting chancellor and his aides made brief courtesy calls Tuesday morning on Premier Nikolai Bulganin and Molotov.

Raab's talks with Molotov — exploring possibilities of concluding a state treaty which would restore Austria's independence and end her four-power occupation — are expected to continue for four days.

Mother, Father, Six Children Perish In Fire

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. (AP)—A mother and father and six children perished early Tuesday as fire leveled a downtown business and apartment building.

More than 50 persons lived in the three-story frame structure in the business section of this upstate horse-racing resort.

Many fled, screaming, to the street, half-dressed. One man was hospitalized with burns.

Mr. and Mrs. Gilbert Abeel, their five children, and 10-year-old Gary la Rue were trapped as the flames engulfed the building.

The ages of the Abeel children ranged up to 11.

The cause of the fire was not determined.

Churchill Leaves Tuesday For Vacation In Sicily

LONDON (AP)—Sir Winston Churchill, clutching a last minute letter from his sovereign, took off from London airport Tuesday for a two-week holiday in Sicily.

Presumably young Queen Elizabeth II was wishing Godspeed to the 90-year-old former Prime Minister on whom she leaned so heavily in the first years of her reign.

But Churchill himself did not know what she said before he left London. The large envelope from Buckingham Palace was handed to him as he chatted in the royal lounge at the Airport. He decided not to open it until he was in the air and said he would spend part of the journey composing an answer.

The stay on the sunny Italian island will be the 80-year-old Churchill's first vacation in more than 18 months. He and his wife will stay at the Villa Politi, a resort hotel near Siracusa.

Truman Wasn't Happy In Post As President

KANSAS CITY (AP)—Harry S. Truman said Tuesday on the 10th anniversary of his entrance into the White House that he "would have been happier if I could have served out the term as vice president."

It was 10 years ago Tuesday night that he took the oath of office, just two and a half hours after being informed of the death of President Franklin D. Roosevelt.

It was in connection with the anniversary that he issued a brief typewritten statement to newsmen. After mentioning he would have been happier to have finished his term as vice president, he added he probably would have gone back to the Senate.

He said he still remembered distinctly the ceremony at which the late Harlan Stone, then chief justice, swore him in as President.

"It was a very solemn occasion," Truman said, "and a great surprise to me because I had hoped that Mr. Roosevelt was well on the road to recovery. He told me when he left for Warm Springs, Ga., that he had a cold and would soon whip it at Warm Springs and be back in the White House."

"As soon as the ceremony was over I held a meeting of the cabinet and the business of the gov-

ernment continued under my direction immediately.

"You all know the history of the period from April 12, 1945, to Jan. 20, 1953. I am going to explain it more completely and thoroughly as soon as I can finish the book I am now working on."
