### Hells Canyon Dam Memorandum Given Senators

WASHINGTON (AP) — A memorandum terming the Hells Canyon controversy a "national issue" has been distributed to Republican senators by the staff of the Senate GOP Policy Committee.

The 21-page memorandum gives the background and arguments for and against the controversy over whether the Hells Canyon reach of the Snake River should be dammed by federal or private power dams.

It was prepared by a policy committee employee, who preferring to remain anonymous, said a "half-dozen" Republican senators had requested that data on the issue be assembled for their use.

buildings at Fairview Home, the school for boys, and the schools for the blind and deaf.

But the Board of Higher Education got only about half of the \$7,085,000 worth of buildings it asked. Projects approved were the classroom and laboratory building at Portland State College \$850,000; physical education building at Southern Oregon College of Education, \$450,000; agriculture and biological science unit at Oregon State College, \$1,800,000; architecture and art building at the University of Oregon, \$50,000; equipment at the dental school \$175,000; and utility tunnel at Oregon State College, \$150,000.

The Legislature worked until the dinner hour Wednesday to get through a big stack of bills.

With only two dissenting votes, the Senate approved the bill levying a 4 per cent tax on income of utilities, and an 8 per cent tax on income of large building rental corporations. This is part of the revenue program, and would raise \$3,600,000 in the biennium.

Another House bill passed by the Senate would provide 10-year sentences for persons convicted for the first time of peddling narcotics, and 20 years for each subsequent conviction.

The House passed and sent to the Senate a bill providing five-year prison terms for persons who beat children with force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Another bill sent to the Senate would ban women boxers and wrestlers from performing in the state.
