MRS. SHERLEY HOSTS SCOUT COMMITTEE

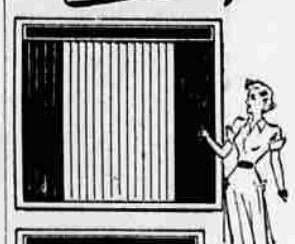
