

## Highway Jingles Won't Be Affected By Measure

SALEM (AP) — The Oregon Legislature's bill to restrict highway billboards won't affect those roadside jingles for shaving cream (Barber Shave). Although the bill, passed Tuesday by the House, says that no company can have advertising signs closer to each other than a half mile, there's an exception and it was put in especially to exempt the well known humorous shaving signs.

The bill permits: "... a group or series of not more than eight signs, conveying a single advertising message, each of which has an area of not more than six square feet."

## Baby Sitter Freed Of Murder Charge In Death Of Child

EPHRATA, Wash. (AP) — The first degree murder charge against Charlotte Mae Brewer was dismissed Friday on motion of Prosecutor Paul A. Klusen Jr. Miss Brewer, 30, was released from the Grant County jail after Superior Judge Robert T. Hunter signed the order dismissing the charge that she killed 21-month-old Deena Starzman while babysitting with the child last Aug. 7 at Grand Coulee, Wash.

Miss Brewer, also known as Kathleen Carnaghan, was arrested in San Francisco last month but protested her innocence, contending the child drowned accidentally.

Klusen, who filed the charge against her in March, said in his motion Friday that the state's case was based "to a large extent on circumstantial evidence" and that it appears "quite possible" death could have been caused by an accidental skull fracture.

He asked for the dismissal on grounds that "the ends of justice would best be served."

Miss Brewer was scheduled to go on trial Monday and the defense had listed 19 witnesses. The Starzman child was found face down in a puddle of water at her parents' Grand Coulee home last summer. It was first reported as a case of accidental drowning. On the "hunch" of the grandmother, the case was reopened, the body exhumed March 9. A doctor said then death was caused by a blow on the head. Miss Brewer was charged and then arrested in San Francisco where she was working as a typist.

**Sheppard's Attorneys Claim New Evidence**  
CLEVELAND (AP) — Attorneys for osteopath Samuel H. Sheppard, convicted of second degree murder in the bludgeoning of his wife, filed a motion Friday for a new trial on the basis of "newly discovered evidence."

Common Pleas Judge Edward Blythin, the man who sentenced Sheppard to life imprisonment, tentatively set April 27 for a hearing on the motion.

The motion was filed by Sheppard's chief defense attorney, William J. Corrigan. Corrigan said the new evidence had been uncovered by Dr. Paul L. Kirk, criminologist from the University of California at Berkeley. Corrigan refused to disclose the nature of the evidence, but said previously that Dr. Kirk found the killer of Marilyn Sheppard was left handed, not right handed like Sheppard.

**FIRE AT McMINNVILLE**

**American Killed Outside Jerusalem's Walled City**  
JERUSALEM, Jordan Sector (AP) — An American citizen, Charles Blair Harris of McCook, Neb., was killed in no man's land outside the Jerusalem wall Friday when he failed to heed the warning of a Jordan sentry, Jordan authorities announced.

Harris, 26, apparently came here as the representative of Lebanon, Neb., with the mayors of six towns named Lebanon in the United States.

## Bomb Explosion Designed To Test Searing Force

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP) — An atomic explosion, designed to test the ability of weapons and supplies to withstand its searing force, flashed across Frenchman Flat at 11:15 a.m. Friday.

A great, white flash was seen here, 75 miles from the Atomic Energy Commission test site. The atomic cloud, a dirty pinkish mushroom, rose rapidly upward. A witness said it looked like a dripping umbrella.

The shot was from a 400-foot tower and was billed as a major test.

Observers from Angel's Peak, 35 miles from the test site, saw a big fireball, described as a "jim dandy." It lasted at least five seconds.

No shock was felt and no sound heard in this resort city, although observers estimated the detonation at perhaps 25 kilotons, or 25,000 tons of TNT.

One of the drone planes to be used in the test was lost on takeoff from Indian Springs.

Another drone plane was substituted.

Three drones were to fly by remote control through the test area. Fighters were to fly nearby to shoot down the drones if they got out of control.

The atomic cloud rose to at least 30,000 feet and moved northeast by east. Winds sheared the cloud.

**Useful Clarification, Says Britain Of Treaty**  
LONDON (AP) — Britain said Friday the Austrian-Russian talks in Moscow has resulted in "some useful clarifications of the Soviet position" of an Austrian treaty.

A foreign office spokesman said: "I would recall that it has long been our desire to see the conclusion at the earliest possible date a treaty which would restore full freedom and independence to Austria."

British informants expressed the view privately they could see little in the published terms to which the Big Three might object. But one source added:

"We have to be very careful not only before we comment but also before we assume everything is settled. We have been a pen's stroke away from full agreement before today only to have the ink-pot dashed away from before us by some sudden and quite unforeseen Russian gambit."

In Bonn, a West German government spokesman said Germany would "sincerely welcome an agreement with Russia that gave Austria its freedom."

The visit of Austrian Chancellor Julius Raab to Moscow has been followed with closest interest by West German officials and public.

**Two Indians Arrested For 'Haircut' Death**  
KLAMATH FALLS (AP) — Two Klamath Reservation Indians were arrested Thursday on manslaughter charges stemming from the "haircut" death of John Madrueno, 25, last February.

They were Leon Gail Pearson, 23, and Melvin Chilquin, 26, who had been indicted secretly by a grand jury earlier this week. Pearson was arrested in Northern California and Chilquin in Portland.

Police said Madrueno attended a party on the reservation last February. Some of those at the party decided to cut off Madrueno's curly locks. He objected, and in the ensuing fight was knocked senseless and thrown out into the snow, where he died of exposure, police said.

Pearson was acquitted last October of a charge involving the death of Gene Ericks, Klamath Falls, who went onto the reservation to fish.

## Fifth Bridge Spanning Columbia River Dedicated

UMATILLA, Ore. (AP) — The fifth bridge spanning the Columbia River between Oregon and Washington was dedicated here Friday by dignitaries of the two states.

Some 2,500 persons stood in blustery, chilly weather to hear Oregon's Gov. Paul Patterson and Washington's Gov. Arthur B. Langlie praise the vision of those who pushed the project.

At 11:35 a. m. Mrs. William Switzer, widow of a pioneer ferry operator, cut the ribbon, and cars carrying the two governors started out across the 5-million-dollar, 3,380-foot bridge for the first crossing.
